## **OBITUARY**



Dr. A. S. Kanagasabapathy

Dr. A.S. Kanagasabapathy began his career in CMC in 1966 and took over leadership of the Clinical Biochemistry department in 1975 till his retirement in 2000 as Professor and Head of this Department. For over three decades, he was deeply involved in promoting the quality of laboratory services and also in teaching and research. Dr. Kanagasabapathy can be truly called the father of quality control in India.

In the year 1977, the executive body of ACBI wanted to start an EQA for the Indian laboratories and Dr Kanagasabapathy took that challenge and did a pilot study. The next year it was started with 58 laboratories, which has expanded to over 10,000 participating laboratories today. The QC program is something he has always been and was passionate about.

Dr. Kanagasabapathy was a Fellow of the Association of Clinical Biochemists of India as well as the National Academy of Clinical Biochemistry of the US. He was a co-founder member of ACBI and was its President in 2000-2001. He received the Awadhesh Saran Memorial Award from ACBI in 2003 and was also the recipient of the ACBI-A.J. Thakur Award for Distinguished Service in Laboratory Medicine 2007. He has served as a member of Scientific Advisory Committees and task forces of the ICMR over these years.

After his retirement, he moved to Hyderabad and was a consultant in the Kamineni Hospital. He continued to contribute much to the scientific community for another two decades Above all, he was a great human. A person with so much of positive thoughts and his motive was to make others happy. A person who would appreciate even the tiniest good work and encouragement. His favourite word was 'Excellent' and indeed he lived an excellent life. Every Clinical Biochemist in this country will remember him for his contribution and personal relationship with all those who knew him. He was a great human being full of positive energy and goodwill. We lost a noble person, but his memories will remain with us forever. He passed away peacefully on 25th October 2024.

Dr P. P. Singh

Dr P. P. Singh was born in 1938. Served in different capacities at RNT Medical College Udaipur and finally superannuated in 1996 from the position of Senior Professor and Head of the Department of Biochemistry. Prof PP Singh organised Annual Conference of ACBI in 1987 at Udaipur and he was President of ACBI for the year 1988.

Prof P. P. Singh had also served as Editor in Chief of Indian Journal of Clinical Biochemistry. Prof P. P. Singh had tremendous research contribution in the field of Nutrition, Oxidative stress and Urolithiasis and published more than 150 articles and several books and book chapters. He was also a recipient of Awdhesh Sharan Memorial Award 2004, Seth G S medical College Oration 1995.

# "From Laboratory to Life: Recent Advances in Basic and Medical Research for Global Healthcare"

#### **CONFERENCE REPORT**

The 50<sup>th</sup> Golden Jubilee Annual Conference of the Association of Clinical Biochemists of India (ACBICON 2024) was organized by the Department of Biochemistry, Post Graduate Institute of Medical Education & Research (PGIMER), Chandigarh at Hotel Mount View, situated in the heart of city surrounded by lush greenery. The conference entitled "From Laboratory to Life: Recent Advances in Basic and Medical Research for Global Healthcare" was held under the auspices of the IFCC (International Federation of Clinical Chemistry and Laboratory Medicine) and APFCB (Asia Pacific Federation for Clinical Biochemistry). It witnessed more than 700 biochemists and medical laboratory professionals from across the country and globe, marking half a century of ACBI's contribution in the field of Clinical biochemistry. The extensive scientific program of the conference was graced by the presence of esteemed national and international dignitaries from sixteen different countries such as USA, Canada, Netherlands, Germany, Hungary, Turkey, Italy, France, Belgium, Australia, Malayasia, South Africa, United Kingdom, Japan and Indonesia. The program included orations, symposia, panel discussions and preconference workshops that provided an enriching platform for experts, to exchange knowledge and discuss the latest advancements in the field. The main conference had three parallel sessions and each one of them witnessed good attendance and active participation from the delegates. Prof Sedef Yenice (Turkey) and Prof Bernard Gouget (France) participated as Visiting Lecturers under the IFCC-Abbott Visiting Lecturer Program (IFCC-VLP). Prof. Yenice's lecture focused on Clinical Laboratory Management, while Prof. Gouget addressed the identification, assessment, and translation of emerging diagnostic technologies and data analysis procedures from academic laboratories to clinical settings. Their contributions provided valuable insights emphasizing the importance of bridging the gap between research and its successful implementation in healthcare.

## Prelude to the 50th ACBICON 2024 Chandigarh: Insightful Pre-Conference Workshops:

Before diving into the scientific content of the conference, seven pre-conference workshops were organized on 4th December 2024, all of which were at full capacity. All the workshops were conducted simultaneously in different departments of PGIMER and Panjab University, Chandigarh. The first workshop entitled Bioinformatics approaches for Transcriptome Data Analysis was designed to unravel the molecular treasures by utilizing the bioinformatics. The workshop was conducted by Dr Veena Puri, Professor in the Department of Bioinformatics in Panjab University, Chandigarh. To enlighten the deeper understanding of molecular techniques, a workshop on digital PCR was also organized. This workshop was conducted by Dr Naresh Sachdeva, Department of Endocrinology. The overview and demonstration of another sophisticated molecular technique, mass spectrometry (LC-MS and GC-MS) was conducted in the workshop entitled Biochemical diagnosis of inborn errors of metabolism, which was organised by Dr Savita Verma Attri and Dr Jayakanthan K, from the Department of Paediatrics, PGIMER, Chandigarh and their team. The workshop also highlighted the genetic screening of newborns for inborn error of metabolism, utility of LC-MS for quantification of amino acids and acyl carnitines, profiling of urine organic acids using GC-MS, their clinical implications and case discussions. The fourth workshop was conducted on Basics of Next Generation Sequencing (NGS) followed by demonstration of NGS Ion Torrent platform for budding researchers by Dr Prateek Bhatia and his team. The fifth workshop focused on the Fundamentals of High-Performance Liquid Chromatography (HPLC), from introducing the technique and its application in detail to practical demonstration, the workshop was conducted in the in the Department of Biochemistry, by Dr. Justin Peter from Thermo Fisher Scientific.

The sixth workshop was on Effective implementation of Self-Directed Learning (SDL) in biochemistry conducted by Dr Sucheta Dandekar, Dr Rohini Bhadre and Dr Farzana Mahdi. Through a deep dive into the importance of SDL in fostering critical thinking, knowledge retention, and lifelong learning, the workshop offered the participants an opportunity to explore the factors that influence motivation and engagement in SDL. The workshop on Proficiency testing was conducted by Dr Pradeep Dabla, Dr Tony Badrick, Dr Pankaj Johri and Dr Pamela Christudoss. It aimed at building the capacity training of laboratory personnel and medical laboratories to meet the quality and accreditation requirements and to reflect current scientific or medical issues that are important to healthcare with framework for interchange of knowledge and expertise.







#### **Conference: Inauguration and Scientific program**

The inaugural ceremony of the conference, held on 05 December 2024, began with the warm welcome address by Dr Indu Verma, the Organizing Secretary of ACBICON 2024. Her address underscored the role of clinical biochemists in healthcare and the continuing need for research and innovation to improve diagnostic practices. She also extended gratitude to all the attendees and emphasized the role of ACBICON 2024 in fostering international collaboration, bringing together experts from around the world to exchange knowledge, research, and best practices ensuring that the conference not only showcased the latest developments but also aligned with the highest scientific and professional benchmarks. The monumental importance of the event was further addressed by Dr Kannan Vaidyanathan, the President of Association of Clinical Biochemists of India (ACBI). The detailed accomplishment of the association along with the annual report of the previous year was provided by the General Secretary, ACBI, Dr Rajiv Ranjan Sinha. The ceremony was graced by the presence of Honourable Chief Guest, Prof. Digambar Behera, a Padma Shree Awardee and NAMS President and the Guest of Honor, Prof. R.K. Ratho, Dean (Academics), PGIMER, Chandigarh. Prof. Behera delivered an inspiring address on healthcare advancements and commended the efforts of the organizers. The inauguration ceremony was followed by a cultural program commemorating the rich heritage from the states of Punjab and Harvana. The program came to a remarkable end with an elaborate dinner at the PGI club, Sector 24, Chandigarh.











The conference embraced the presence of seven distinguished orations spread over three days, which focused on advancements in basic and medical research in India: K.L. Gupta Memorial Oration delivered by Dr Sanjay Gupta, Professor, ACTREC-Tata Memorial Centre, Navi Mumbai, who described the emerging epigenomic landscape of Gastrointestinal Cancer, with a particular emphasis on its biology and clinical implication in precision medicine. In K.E.M. Hospital & Seth GS Medical College Oration, Dr Sadhna Sharma, ex-HOD, Department of Biochemistry, PGIMER, Chandigarh, highlighted the importance of understanding the molecular dynamics of diabetes and tuberculosis co-pathogenesis. Dr Tapas K. Kundu, Professor, JNCASR, Bangalore, who delivered the prestigious Dr Awadesh Saran Memorial Oration, shed light on the epigenetic regulation of neurological disorders. Dr T.N. Patabhiraman Oration was delivered by Dr Jawahar Kalra, Professor, University of Saskatchewan, Canada, who discussed the intersection of innovation

and patient-centric care that can provide the best practice model for medical error disclosures, thereby helping in the advancement of clinical biochemistry.

Dr Taranath Shetty Memorial Oration by Dr Vivek Lal, Director, PGIMER, Chandigarh, illuminated the complex interplay of many biochemical changes in migraine followed by the crucial understanding of the biochemical signalling pathways that could identify novel therapeutic targets for managing patients unresponsive to conventional antimigraine therapies. Dr Praveen Sharma Oration presented by Dr Subir Kumar Das, Professor, College of Medicine & JNM Hospital, Kalyani, highlighted the influence of soluble factors and total cell-free DNA in the development of preeclampsia. Dr Amitava Das Gupta, Professor, University of Kansas Medical College, Kansas, USA was awarded with Mrs. & Dr G.P. Talwar Oration, and he addressed the clinical utility of biomarkers in Alzheimer's disease and discussed the implementation of these tests in clinical laboratory.







The 50th ACBICON 2024 was meticulously organized, featuring twenty-six symposia and three panel discussions spread over three days, divided into four parallel segments across distinct halls, each dedicated to specific themes. The first day of the conference featured nine symposia, four oral presentation sessions by young faculty, three oral presentation sessions by researchers, and one panel discussion followed by a grand inauguration of the conference. Day two comprised ten symposia with three oral presentation sessions by faculty, two oral presentation sessions by students, one panel discussion, five industrial lectures which ended with a banquet dinner. The final day showcased seven symposia with one panel discussion, and two industrial lectures which concluded with a valedictory function. Renowned personalities from the field of clinical biochemistry and laboratory medicine chaired the sessions, enriching the discussions with their expertise. Similar topics were clubbed into symposia and expert speakers, in the respective fields, presented their talks, ensuring comprehensive learning for the delegates regardless of their prior knowledge of the subject. Each presentation was followed by a Q&A segment, fostering active engagement and facilitating a deeper understanding of the topics discussed.

The first session commenced with a discussion on global issues in laboratory medicine, led by esteemed international dignitaries such as Dr Qing Meng (USA), Dr Khosrow Adeli (Canada), Dr Tony Badrick (Australia), and Dr Endang Hoyaranda (Indonesia). Dr Meng presented the performance of external quality assessments in ten countries in an IFCC global laboratory quality project. The IFCC's leadership in clinical laboratory standardization and harmonization was discussed by Dr Khosrow Adeli, following which Dr Tony Badrick addressed how external quality assessments (EQA) can reduce patient risk by comparing results across methods. Finally, Dr Endang Hoyaranda highlighted the sustainability concerns for medical laboratories. A parallel session focussed on the topics related to Diabetes & Metabolic syndrome and gastrointestinal disorders. The highlight was the symposium by the IFCC Committee on Clinical Laboratory Management (IFCC-CCLM) that covered topics such as managing patient and physician expectations to improve satisfaction with clinical laboratory services, presented by Dr Merve Sibel Gungoren from Turkey, the role of leadership in value-based laboratory utilization discussed by Dr Praveen Sharma, and the challenges and strategies for continuous quality improvement in medical laboratories addressed by Dr Sedef Yenice from Turkey. One of the sessions also focussed on bone disorders that was led by Dr Harjit Pal Bhattoa from Hungary speaking on the clinical utility of bone turnover markers.

The next group of sessions began with the talks on cardiovascular diseases and its risk management and therapeutics which were explored by Dr Tahir Pillay (South Africa), Dr Suresh Kumar Verma (USA) and Dr Shantanu Sengupta (India). It also included a virtual talk from Dr Christa Cobbaert (Netherlands) on the clinical evaluation of a multiplex apolipoprotein panel in the Odyssey outcomes randomized control trial, addressing the residual cardiovascular risk with precision diagnostics. The role of nutrients in health outcomes was covered by Dr Sadanand Naik who discussed about vitamin B12 deficiency and perinatal health followed by talks related to the topic by Dr Ashwin Laxmikant Kotnis and Dr Namita Mahalle. The area of kidney disorders and prostate cancer were simultaneously explored by prominent international speakers Dr Joris Delanghe from Belgium and Dr Pavai Sthaneswar from Malaysia. Next day, the sessions commenced with the discussion on exposomes by the members of IFCC Emerging technologies division (IFCC-ETD) - Dr Bernard Gouget from France, Dr Damien Gruson from Belgium and Dr Swarup Shah from India. Parallelly, the eleventh session focussed on artificial intelligence in lab medicine, chaired by Dr Jawahar Kalra and Dr Deepak Parchwani. Dr Sergio Bernardini (Italy) opened the session with a talk on how machine learning is transforming lab and clinical decision support tools. The session also covered topics like building data-driven, AI augmented AMR stewardship, surveillance, and exploring clinico-demographic, radiological, biochemical and proteomic parameter based predictive algorithms as a diagnostic tool in detecting risk of ovarian cancer by Dr Tavpritesh Sethi and Dr Suchitra Kumari respectively. The recent advances in inborn errors of metabolism were intricately spoken about by Dr Kannan Vaidyanathan and Dr Sohini Sengupta on molecular diagnosis of metabolic disorders and maternal screening for fetal anomalies respectively. Dr Anibhh Martin Das from Germany also joined the session virtually and discussed about the pathophysiology, clinical symptoms and treatment options in type I glycogen storage disease. The deep dive into the immune mechanisms of various diseases was provided in two parallel sessions. Elaborate discussions on haematological malignancies and other cancers (from diagnosis to therapeutics) garnered a huge audience. Dr Debabrata Dash discussed how platelets support cancer growth and spread by interacting with tumour cells. Dr Hari K. Koul from USA, delivered an online talk,

highlighting the role of proatate derived ETS transcription factor as a novel biomarker for early detection of lethal prostate cancer. Toxicology became the mainstay discussion in session 15 addressing the effect of cadmium exposure during gestation and lactation on memory and learning in F1 generation mice by Dr Rajarshi Kar, the impact, risks, and remediation of lead toxicity in health issues by Dr Shailja Sharma and environmental fusario-toxins in food and their impacts on the epigenome and cancer risk by Dr Anil Chuturgoon (South Africa). The session on recent developments in Point-of-Care Testing (POCT) included virtual discussions on the use of artificial intelligence in POCT by Dr Adil Khan (USA) and, current performance and future goals of POCT for HbA1c testing by Dr Emma English (UK). The importance of connectivity and data management in POCT by Dr Tjan Sian Hwa (Indonesia), and advancements in the development of POCT devices for non-infectious diseases by Dr Sudha Srivastava (India) were discussed in person during the session. The concluding session of the day included discussions on the recent issues in laboratory medicine. It had a meticulous talk on the use of data-driven decision-making in clinical laboratories for precision practice by Dr Sedef Yenice (Turkey), risk management strategies in clinical laboratories by Dr Neeraj Jain, and the importance of properly implementing DQ, IQ, OQ, and PQ to drive sustainability initiatives in smart laboratory environments by Dr Barnali Das. This was followed by an invigorating experience of the grand finale round of AFMC quiz with 5 teams on the stage and tension amongst the audience. The day came to an end with general body meeting discussing various agendas of the association.

















The banquet dinner of the 50th ACBICON 2024 was organized at the Chandigarh Golf Club on the evening of 6th December 2024. The evening was an exquisite celebration that delivered a truly unforgettable experience highlighting the diverse culinary spread, ranging from traditional Punjabi dishes to international cuisines. The banquet was a perfect fusion of music and ambience making attendees of all ages dance and enjoy. It epitomized the balance of intellectual engagement and social enjoyment that defined the Golden

jubilee celebration of ACBICON and provided an impressive and dynamic conclusion to a remarkable event. The last day of the conference began with a conversation on Proficiency testing, focusing on improving global lab quality, validating pre-analytical scoring, selecting PT materials, and evaluating tumour marker proficiency by Dr Qing Meng, Dr Shyamali Pal and Dr T Venkatesh.

The topic on longitudinal evaluation of tumour marker proficiency testing was virtually discussed by Dr Stefan Holdenreider from Germany. A parallel session on Biomarkers was summed up in detail by Prof. Maurizio Ferrari (Italy), Dr Ravinder Singh (USA), Dr Navneet Dhillon (USA), and Dr Bidhan Chandra Koner. In the next set of parallel sessions, area of precision medicine led by Dr Neeraj Sharma (USA), Dr Binu Kumar, Dr Sudip Kumar Datta and Dr Jatinder Lamba (USA) focused on innovative approaches in personalized healthcare. A series of standout talks on Drug delivery and therapeutics, chaired by Dr Vishwajeet Rohil and Dr Sadhna Sharma, explored treatment strategies for cognitive deficits in temporal lobe epilepsy by Dr B S S Rao followed by detailed discussions by Dr Indu Pal Kaur and Dr. Kalyan Goswami. The emerging era of OMICS in health and diseases, discussed by Dr Sandeep Kumar Saxena, Dr Medha Rajappa, and Dr Rajvir Dahiya (virtually), focused on the

integration of genomic, epigenomic, and proteomic approaches in assessing cardiovascular risk in chronic kidney disease, and the application of novel mRNA genomics technology for precision medicine in prostate cancer respectively. The final session of the conference on Neurodegenerative and Mental health disorders covered topics such as metabolism in multiple sclerosis by Dr Shailendra Giri (USA), the neuroprotective potential of Bacopa monnieri in Parkinson's disease by Dr Shivani Pandey and the protective role of reduced DRP1 in Alzheimer's disease by Dr Ramesh Kandimalla. The day concluded with a lecture by Dr Bernard Gouget and valedictory function where multiple ACBI and organising committee awards were handed out to delegates presenting oral and poster presentations.







The scientific program's major highlights were the elaborated three different panel discussions conducted on the three days of the conference that attracted a huge audience. The first panel discussion on Molecular diagnostics was first of its kind in the ACBI conference and it received an overwhelming response from the delegates. The panel was convened by Dr Kannan Vaidyanathan, chaired by Dr Tahir Pillay and included significant role of RNAs in human cells, the expert





such as Dr Mithu Banerjee, Dr Neeraj Sharma, Dr Prateek Bhatia, Dr Amanjit Bal, Dr Mini P. Singh and Dr Swarup Shah. They discussed on multiple facets of molecular diagnostics including real time and digital droplet-based PCR diagnostics, NGS for the diagnosis of cancers and functional evaluation of variants and personalized treatments through the lens of pharmacogenetics.

Second day of the conference witnessed another panel discussion on "Laboratory accreditation in government setups: challenges and solutions" convened by Dr Sudip Kumar Dutta with a panel of clinical biochemist experts from across the country. A third panel discussion of the conference on biological reference intervals was held which was convened by Dr Seema Bhargava with a panel of seven members - Dr Sudip Kumar Dutta, Dr Barnali Das, Dr Swarup Shah, Dr Nilesh Chandra, Dr Mamta Kankra and Dr Kiyoshi Ichihara.







#### **Poster and Oral Presentations**

The 50th ACBICON witnessed more than 200 poster presentations and around 80 oral presentations encouraging residents, research scholars and young faculties with a platform to present their research work. Poster presentations increased the visibility of their research work and attracted the attention of fellow researchers and delegates, thereby providing excellent networking opportunities. Oral presentations on the other hand, allowed for in-depth exploration of topics followed by healthy discussions. The oral and poster presentations were critically evaluated by a panel of judges and the winners were awarded with cash prizes and certificates for their exceptional contributions during the valedictory. The essence of the event was further enriched by the AFMC Quiz competition that was organized by AFMC team, Pune. The quiz ignited a student's quest, encouraging them to explore the subject matter in greater depth beyond traditional textbooks and actively engaged the participants and the audience in a fun and competitive environment.

#### **IMPORTANT NOTICE:**

# STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURE (SOP) FOR CONDUCTING THE ZONAL ACBI CONFERENCE

#### 1. Purpose:

To outline the procedures for organizing and executing the Zonal ACBI Conference in accordance with established guidelines, ensuring the event's success and alignment with ACBI objectives.

#### 2. Scope:

This SOP applies to all team members and stakeholders involved in the planning, organization, and execution of the Zonal ACBI Conference.

#### As per the constitution of ACBI, definition of Zones:

**Zonal Branch:** ACBI would encourage the formation of five zonal branches divided broadly based on Government categorization (representing East, West, North, South and Central zones) to promote scientific activities.

The **Northern Zone** comprises the States of Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir, Punjab, Rajasthan, the National Capital Territory of Delhi and the Union Territory of Chandigarh;

The **Central Zone** comprising the States of Chhattisgarh, Uttarakhand, Uttar Pradesh and Madhya Pradesh;

The **Eastern Zone**, comprising the States of Bihar, Jharkhand, Orissa, Sikkim, West Bengal and North-Eastern states;

The **Western Zone**, comprising the States of Goa, Gujarat, Maharashtra and the Union Territories of Daman & Diu and Dadra & Nagar Haveli;

The **Southern Zone** comprises the States of Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Karnataka, Kerala, Tamil Nadu and the Union Territory of Pondicherry.

#### 3. Who can propose for the Zonal conference?

The proposer should be a Life member of ACBI of at least 10 years standing as member and must be a senior member of the profession being held in high regard. He/she should have been regularly

attending ACBI conferences and contributing significantly to the academic activities. He/she should have shown leadership qualities as evidenced by active participation in activities of ACBI either at the state or at national level, organizations of scientific meetings and influenced at least 10 biochemists for enrollment as member of ACBI.

#### 4. Responsibilities:

#### Conference Chairperson/ Organizing Chairman/ Secretary:

- o Overall event management and coordination.
- o Handling logistics, scheduling, and on-site operations.
  - o Budget management and financial oversight.
- Managing invitations, marketing, and communications.

#### • Conference Organizing Committee

The Organizing Secretary shall form a Conference Organizing Committee for managing the conference. This committee shall manage and look after the following activities:

- (1) **Scientific Committee:** Management of scientific activity which will include paper presentation (oral & Posters), seminar, symposia, workshops, guest lectures and demonstrations,
  - (2) Accommodation,
  - (3) Transport and travels,
  - (4) Food
  - (5) Cultural and social programmes,
  - (6) Finance,
  - (7) Volunteers,

#### 4. Pre-Conference Planning:

#### 4.1 Target Audience and Speakers

**Delegate Focus:** Zonal conferences are designed for delegates from the states within the specific zone hosting the event.

To maintain a localized and relevant audience, participation by delegates from outside the zone should be **discouraged.** 

According to ACBI's zonal divisions, only the states within the designated zone should be allowed to attend. This approach will reduce event costs and increase attendance, as delegates from nearby states will find it easier to participate.

The Organizing Secretary must ensure the inclusion of dedicated sessions for oral presentations, posters, and quiz to engage and attract younger Post Graduates, Research students/Biochemists with prizes.

**Speakers:** The conference may include speakers of national or international repute to ensure high-quality presentations and discussions that offer valuable insights to attendees.

#### 4.2 Permission from ACBI Executive Board:

Before announcing the Zonal Conference, the organizing committee must obtain permission from President ACBI and General Secretary, ACBI. This approval is necessary to ensure that the conference adheres to ACBI's objectives and allows for the use of ACBI and partner logos in promotional materials in the event.

**Approval Process:** After a small organizing team has been formed, then the organizing Secretary should write an email addressed to the President, ACBI with a copy to General Secretary, for permission to host the Zonal conference. Apart from that they can also request for the use of the association's logo on all promotional materials.

## 4.3. Conference Duration and Pre-Conference Activities

**Main Conference:** Conduct the Zonal Conference as a one-day event either physical or online or hybrid to make it localized, approachable, and affordable for delegates from the states within that zone.

**Pre-Conference Activities:** It is desirable to offer workshops or Continuing Medical Education (CME) sessions for up to half a day before the main

conference to provide additional hands-on training. However, it is up to the organizing secretary to decide whether to include Pre-Conference Activities based on their financial budget and convenience.

**Note** – ACBI prefers that the Zonal Conferences be planned using an online platform. ACBI will make the platform available for this purpose.

#### **Arrangement for Scientific Sessions:**

Required number of Halls of adequate size and facility, having a screen and proper lighting arrangement for switching on & off all the lights of the room, should be available for parallel sessions (if needed). A Laptop/Desktop, LCD projector along with PA system should be made available in each hall. One set of projectors should be kept reserved for failure of this equipment in any hall. There should be a trained projectionist well versed in using those projectors available for each hall. In addition, there should be a proper lectern, collar mike and light pointer.

One responsible persons for each scientific session (cocoordinator) with a volunteer should be deputed for each session whose work will be to see that the Chairpersons are informed in time, every facility is available, and session starts in time and keep memento/certificate ready for being presented to the chairpersons and speakers.

Any change in the programme or arrangement of the scientific programme should be promptly and prominently displayed near the registration area and in front of each hall.

#### 4.4. Funding and Financial Management:

After the formation of the organizing committee, thought has to be put to the opening of a bank account for the conference.

At first one will need to get a PAN card in the name of the conference. They can contact their CA for help. ACBI HQ can provide the association's Registration papers and Constitution for this. Only after this process can they open a bank account. They can then surrender their PAN after completion of the final audit of the conference and closure of the congress account.

The ACBI head office must be informed of all processes and should send the final audited accounts of the conference to HQ.

On no account will ACBI HQ allow the use of its PAN Number for such conferences, except the ones which are organized by the Head office.

#### **Funding Sources:**

- Registration Fees: Charge delegates registration fees to cover conference costs.
- Seed Money: Request initial funding from ACBI HQ for preliminary expenses. ACBI secretariat has a provision for refundable seed money of Rs.25,000/-
- Institutional Support: Organizing secretaries should seek institutional support from the host institution. Ensure compliance with necessary permissions and tax obligations, including GST, Income Tax, and any other liabilities as per Government of India guidelines.
- Corporate / Knowledge Partner: Secure assistance from one or two corporates or knowledge partners for additional handholding for the conference resources.
  - Advertising fees for the souvenirs and charges for booking exhibition stalls.
  - Sponsorships for symposia, workshops or for invited speakers
  - **4.5. Timing of the Conference Schedule:** Hold the Zonal Conference at least six months before the National Annual ACBI Conference to allow sufficient preparation time and avoid overlaps with other major events.
- **4.6. Venue:** The Zonal Representative should ensure that the conference venue is selected in different states of the zone. The same state should not be selected for the next three years

#### 5. Post-Conference Planning:

#### 5.1. Final Report Submission

The Account of the conference should be audited and a full report along with statement of income and expenditure in detail should be presented to the General Secretary.

5.2 Sharing of Savings from the Conference:
40% of the savings generated from the conference shall be transferred to the ACBI Head Office. The remaining 60% will be utilized to strengthen academic activities within the zone.

#### **Report Preparation:**

- A brief report of the conference, including a Summary of key discussions and outcomes and photographs for visual documentation.
- The report should be sent by email to the ACBI Secretary so that it may be published in the next ACBI News Bulletin.

#### 5.3. Follow-up

- **Thank You Notes**: Send appreciation notes to speakers, sponsors, and volunteers.
- Documentation: Archive all relevant documentation, including financial records and feedback.

By following this SOP, the Zonal ACBI Conference will be effectively organized, ensuring high quality, relevance, and adherence to ACBI standards.

#### MINUTES OF THE PRE-GB EXECUTIVE COUNCIL MEETING

December 4, 2024, 5.00 p.m. Lecture Theatre, Dept. of Biochemistry, 3<sup>rd</sup>. Floor, Research Block A, PGIMER

The Executive Council (EC) of ACBI met on December 04, 2024 at 5.00 pm in the Lecture Theatre of Dept of Biochemistry, 3rd. Floor, and Research Block A, PGIMER. The Executive Council meeting was presided over by Dr. Kannan Vaidyanathan, President ACBI.

The meeting started with all members observing a 2 minutes silence in the memory of Dr. A. S. Kanagasabapathy and Dr P. P. Singh.

Dr. A.S. Kanagasabapathy began his career in CMC in 1966 and took over leadership of the Clinical Biochemistry department in 1975 till his retirement in 2000 as Professor and Head of this Department. For over three decades, he was deeply involved in promoting the quality of laboratory services and in teaching and research. Dr. Kanagasabapathy can be truly called the father of quality control in India. In the year 1977, the executive body of ACBI wanted to start an EQA program for the Indian laboratories and Dr Kanagasabapathy took that challenge and did a pilot study. The next year it was started with 58 laboratories, which has expanded to over 10,000 participating laboratories today. The QC program is something he has always been and was passionate about.

Dr. Kanagasabapathy was a Fellow of the Association of Clinical Biochemists of India as well as the National Academy of Clinical Biochemistry of the US. He was a cofounder member of ACBI and was its President in 2000-2001. He received the Awadhesh Saran Memorial Award from ACBI in 2003 and was also the recipient of the ACBI-A.J. Thakur Award for Distinguished Service in Laboratory Medicine 2007. He has served as a member of Scientific Advisory Committees and task forces of the ICMR over these years.

After his retirement, he moved to Hyderabad and was a consultant in the Kamineni Hospital. He continued to contribute much to the scientific community for another two decades Above all, he was a great human. A person with so much of positive thoughts and his motive was to make others happy. A person who would appreciate even the tiniest good work and encouragement. His favourite word was 'Excellent' and indeed he lived an excellent life.

Every Clinical Biochemist in this country will remember him for his contribution and personal relationship with all

those who knew him. He was a great human being full of positive energy and goodwill. We lost a noble person, but his memories will remain with us forever. He passed away peacefully on 25th October 2024.

Dr P. P. Singh was born in 1938. Served in different capacities at RNT Medical College Udaipur and finally superannuated in 1996 from the position of Senior Professor and Head of the Department of Biochemistry. Prof PP Singh organised Annual Conference of ACBI in 1987 at Udaipur and he was President of ACBI for the year 1988. Prof PP Singh had also served as Editor in Chief of Indian Journal of Clinical Biochemistry. Prof P P singh had tremendous research contribution in the field of Nutrition, Oxidative stress and Urolithiasis and published more than 150 articles and several books and book chapters. He was also receipient of Awdhesh Sharan Memorial Award 2004, Seth G S medical College Oration 1995. He passed away on 28th. October 2024.

Dr. Rajiv R Sinha, General Secretary of ACBI presented the minutes of the previous EC meeting and the same was accepted by the council. Dr Rajiv R Sinha, General Secretary, presented the Annual Report of the association for the year 2024 which would be read out during the inaugural function. Accounts of the ACBI for the year 2023-2024 was presented by the Treasurer, Dr K. R. Prasad. The Treasurer informed members present about the current state of affairs of the association accounts. EC members lauded the efforts of Dr. Praveen Sharma, his editorial team and Springer for their untiring effort to keep the IJCB's standard flying high.

The Convener of the ACBI/CMC-Vellore External Quality Assurance Program, Dr. Pamela Christudoss, presented the report on the ongoing EQA program for the year 2023-2024. She informed the EC that it is the 46th, year of the CMC EQAS under the aegis of ACBI and was happy to mention that the vision and mission for which this programme had evolved 46 years ago, with 58 laboratories in 1978 has been gracefully taken forward to help the Indian labs - very small, small, medium, large, from private sector, Govt. hospital labs and even PHC'S. With increasing awareness of the importance of Quality control and External quality control in medical labs in India, the ACBI-CMC EQAS has witnessed its growth in all dimensions with the increase in participating labs in the last few years and as of the year 2024, 14,000 lab participants registered in 12 different program which are accredited according to the ISO 17043:2010 standards.. Members raised the issue of signing of MOU between ACBI & management of CMC Vellore regarding naming the EQAS program as ACBI-CMC VELLORE EQAS, as was decided in the previous Council meeting. Dr Pamela informed the house that she would inform the Secretary regarding the decision of the management of CMC. At this point all members thanked the Department of Clinical Biochemistry and the management for CMC, Vellore for their effort & zeal in successfully running this programme for 46 years.

Mr. Upendra Singh, Convener of the ACBI-Corporate wing informed the members that one meeting with the corporate wing was held in New Delhi to solicit support for the 50th Annual conference in Chandigarh.

The General Secretary, Dr. Rajiv R. Sinha presented the new applications received for individual membership. He informed that in 2024, the total number of new applicants for membership was Life member = 84, Associate Life member = 10, Life member by Instalment – 4 and 1 Corporate member (HORIBA India Pvt Ltd). approved all the new applications. The Secretary, Dr Rajiv Sinha informed the members that as of today our total Active membership strength stands at 2857, of which Life Members are 2542, Associate Life members – 247, Ordinary/Annual Members – 34, Corporate Members – 33 and Honorary Members – 1.

Dr Rajiv Sinha informed the members about the 17th. APFCB Congress, which was held at the ICC, Sydney from 31st. to 3rd. November 2024. It was a well-attended meeting and many delegates from India were present there. The next APFCB Congress will be held in 2027 in Malaysia.

The 33rd. WASPaLM Congress & 24th National Clinical Biochemistry Congress was held from 16th. To 20th. October at Granada Congress Centre, Belek-Antalya, Turkey. It was a very well organized and well-attended conference. The WASPaLM EB board meeting was also held.

The Secretary, Dr. Rajiv R Sinha placed before the EC, the applications received in response to the notification given in the ACBI News bulletin to fill the post of one Vice-President, Joint Secretary (HQ) and State Representatives.

The President announced that there was two nomination for the post of Vice-President for which Dr Harsh Vardhan Singh (Delhi), Dr Deepak Parchwani have applied and both their nominations are in order. One nomination of Dr Deepak Parchwani was also received for Joint Secretary (HQ). Names were received for State Representatives. For the post of State Representative, EC validated the applications received from Delhi, Haryana, Telangana, Bihar, Maharashtra, Chandigarh, and UP & West Bengal for presentation before GB.

The EC was informed by the secretary that request for organizing 51st. ACBI National conference in 2025 was approved by the EC & was awarded to Dr Sadanand Naik, KEM Hospital Pune. He was requested to appear before the EC during the Chandigarh conference and reiterate his position to host the 2025 conference. Dr Sadanand Naik has reiterated his position to organize the 2025 ACBICON in Pune along with the 34th. WASPaLM and it was accepted by the EC. The Secretary informed the EC that application was also received from Dr. Dharamveer Yadav, Additional Professor, Department of Biochemistry, AIIMS Jodhpur, be allowed to host the 53rd. ACBICON 2027 at AIIMS, Jodhpur. Jodhpur last hosted the 2015 ACBICON. The applications was approved with Dr. Mithu Bannerjee as the organizing Secretary and were to be placed before the GB for discussion and approval.

Dr. D. M. Vasudevan, Past President & Director, Indian Board of Clinical Biochemistry, presented a report on the progress of the Membership course of the Association. The course was started on 1st January 2013. The syllabus was approved by the ACBI. The course is for 3 years, with 30 topics. Dr

The Secretary placed before the EC the proposal from Prof. R. L. Mattoo (Past President, Jammu) for starting an award in his name in the field of Analytical Biochemistry/Methodologies category. He is willing to contribute 2.0 lacs for this. The EC approved this proposal and agreed to start a Poster Awards as – PROF. R. L. MATOO BEST POSTER AWARD IN THE FIELD OF ANALYTICAL BIOCHEMISTRY/METHODOLOGIES.

The General Secretary, ACBI expressed his desire for making an effort in increasing the involvement of young association members in the activities of ACBI and also to start a YOUNG SCIENTISTS FORUM. Members were requested to suggest ways to do this? They were requested to send their suggestions by email.

Dr Rajiv Sinha informed the members about the preparation done so far regarding hosting WASPaLM 2025 in Pune. He informed that WESTEIN, Koregaon Park has been selected as the venue and Mike Hospitalities have been onboarded as PCO for this congress. He informed members about the website being activated by 15th. February 2025 and the sponsorship brochure will also be ready on time.

Dr Rajiv Sinha informed the members about the preparation done so far regarding hosting IFCC WORLDLAB 2026 in New Delhi. He informed that a meeting of the Congress Organizng Committee (COC) was held in Delhi on 19th & 20th November

2024. Dr Tomris Ozben, President IFCC was in the chair. The COC members visited all selected venues and then had the deciding meeting on 20th. November. The time schedule for the congress was prepared and shared amongst members.

The Secretary then informed the members about ACBI Zonal Conferences which are being conducted by the different Zones of the association. He explained that we do not have any guidelines that the zonal committee has to follow for the successful conduct of the conference. Dr Sinha explained that

many organizers hold it just like a National Conference for 2 – 3 days and invite people from all over the country to participate. It was suggested that Zonal conferences should preferably be of 1-day duration and as far as possible members from the same zone should be invited. With this background, an SOP for the conduct of ACBI Zonal Conferences was drawn up and circulated amongst ACBI EB members. After incorporating the different suggestions, it was then circulated to all Executive Council members. All the members present approved the SOP for zonal conferences and requested the Secretary to incorporate it into the ACBI constitution. This would be put up in GB for final approval.

The Secretary placed before the EC issues related to Agenda for the 50th. Annual GB meeting. The Draft copy was placed before EC for its consideration & review. The EC approved of the agenda.

With the permission of the chair, EC members raised the following points for consideration and follow up action.

## a) Points regarding conduct of ACBI National Conference.

Points were raised regarding conduct of our National conference especially related to finance. Many organizing secretaries have been taking refundable advance from ACBI Head Office and then showing a deficit at the final accounting stage. Members were pained and expressed unhappiness on this state of affair.

#### The following suggestions were received:

Financial Responsibility. It was suggested that either the General Secretary or Treasurer should always be a part of the conference organizing committee and one of them should be a Co-Signatory to all payments.

Cash dealing should be completely prohibited.

The Secretary was requested to explore the option of having the conference account under the eyes of ACBI Head office.

A few Past Presidents pointed out that ACBI is the only National Body, which allows free registration and accommodation to all its EB members & Past presidents. Members pointed out that in other conferences everyone has to pay registration fees including the President & Secretary. Because of this those societies are not so desperate for fundings.

It was suggested that we can also do this in our national conference, i.e. All EC members have to pay registration charges. It was also suggested that Invited speakers should be offered 2 nights stay & free registration (as done internationally)

#### b) Change of Name of the association:

The Secretary informed all present that last year during the 49th Pre-GB & GB meeting, suggestions had been received from members to expand the role & horizon of our association. It was suggested that we should add the word "Laboratory Medicine" to our name. Amongst the various names that were suggested were

- ASSOCIATION OF CLINICAL BIOCHEMISTS & LABORATORY MEDICINE OF INDIA.
- ASSOCIATION FOR CLINICAL BIOCHEMISTRY & LABORATORY MEDICINE OF INDIA
- ASSOCIATION OF CLINICAL BIOCHEMISTRY & LABORATORY MEDICINE PROFESSIONALS OF INDIA

After a lot of discussion, it was suggested that the name may be: ASSOCIATION FOR CLINICAL BIOCHEMISTRY & LABORATORY MEDICINE OF INDIA

It was unanimously resolved that the abbreviation will remains as ACBI with the expanded name written underneath (Just like IFCC & APFCB). This will be put up at the GB for discussion & final decision. Once approved, then the Constitution has to be modified and membership criteria will have to changed to reflect the new character of the association.

#### c) Travel Grant to students of MIBCB.

Dr Kannan Vaidyanathan requested that students enrolled in the MIBCB program have to compulsorily attend the National conference. Not all are able to afford travel and he requested that ACBI Head Office might consider providing Travel assistance to them, if required. The

house accepted the suggestion and requested that it be approve by the GB.

The Executive Council recorded its appreciation on the excellent leadership provided by Dr Kannan Vaidyanthan, the President during the year 2024, in carrying out the activities of ACBI.

Dr P. P. Singh was born in 1938. Served in different capacities at RNT Medical College Udaipur and finally superannuated in 1996 from the position of Senior Professor and Head of the Department of Biochemistry. Prof PP Singh organised Annual Conference of ACBI in 1987 at Udaipur and he was President of ACBI for the year 1988. Prof PP Singh had also served as Editor in Chief of Indian Journal of Clinical Biochemistry. Prof P P singh had tremendous research contribution in the field of Nutrition, Oxidative stress and Urolithiasis and published more than 150 articles and several books and book chapters. He was also recipient of Awdhesh Sharan Memorial Award 2004, Seth G S medical College Oration 1995. He passed away on 28th. October 2024.

The General Secretary, Dr. Rajiv R. Sinha, placed before the house the minutes of the 49th. General Body meeting held in Trivandrum under the chairmanship of Dr Kannan Vaidyanathan, which was earlier circulated through March 2024 issue of the ACBI News Bulletin. (Volume No.52/ No.-01). As there were no comments received, the minutes were approved by the house.

The GB was informed by the secretary that request for organizing 51st. ACBI National conference in 2025 was approved by the EC in the 2024 GB meeting & was awarded to Dr Sadanand Naik, KEM Hospital Pune. He was requested to appear before the EC during the Chandigarh conference and reiterate his position to host the 2025 conference. Dr Sadanand Naik has reiterated his position to organize the 2025 ACBICON in Pune, which is to be held along with the 34th. WASPaLM. His proposal has been vetted by the Executive Board and is in order. The house unanimously decided to hold the 51st. 2025 Annual National Conference in Pune with Sadanand Naik as organizing secretary.

The Secretary also informed the GB that application was received from Dr. Dharamveer Yadav, Additional Professor, Department of Biochemistry, AIIMS Jodhpur that he be allowed to host the 53rd. ACBICON 2027 at AIIMS, Jodhpur. Jodhpur last hosted the 2015 ACBICON. The applications was

approved by the EB with Dr. Mithu Bannerjee, Prof & Head as the organizing Secretary. Dr Mithu was to reiterate her willingness during the Pune conference. The GB approved this decision. The secretary informed the house that the 2026 National Conference will take place along with the 2026 IFCC WorldLab in New Delhi. He also informed that no decision was taken on this matter.

The GB was informed of the important decisions taken at the Pre-GB Executive Council meeting held on December 4th. The GB ratified the decisions taken during the 50th. Pre-GB EC meeting as noted below.

- 1. The Secretary placed before the house the matter relating to the MIBCB course. Dr Vasudevan had stressed, during the Pre-GB EC meeting, on the point that there are very few takers for this course now and applicants have raised the issue of the purpose of this course as it does not assist them in getting a job. The EC discussed about the relevance of the MIBCB course and ways and means to increase its relevance & reach. Some suggestion was to have various subject modules and explore to start the online course. The EC formed a committee under the leadership of President, ACBI, Dr Indu Verma with the following members:
  - 1) Dr Indu Verma, Chair
  - 2) Dr Kannan Vaidyanathan
  - 3) Dr Seema Bhargava
  - 4) Dr Harsh Vardhan Singh
  - 5) Dr Sudeep Datta
  - 6) Dr Arnab Pal

## They are to submit their report within 3 months to the Secretary.

2. The Secretary informed the members of the GB that he had received suggestions from members to expand the role & horizon of our association. He explained that our role as Clinical Biochemists has undergone a vast change over the years. It was suggested that we should add the word "Laboratory Medicine" to our name, ACBI. He informed all about such an addition to the names of the international societies like IFCC – International Federation of Clinical Chemistry & Laboratory Medicine, APFCB – Asian-Pacific Federation of Clinical Biochemistry & Laboratory Medicine and AACC – Association for Diagnostic & Laboratory Medicine (ADLM).

The Secretary informed all present that last year during the 49th Pre-GB & GB meeting, suggestions had been received from members to expand the role & horizon of our association. It was suggested that we should add the word "Laboratory Medicine" to our name. After a lot of discussion, it was suggested that the name may be:

## "ASSOCIATION FOR CLINICAL BIOCHEMISTRY & LABORATORY MEDICINE OF INDIA"

It was unanimously resolved that the abbreviation will remains as ACBI with the expanded name written underneath (Just like IFCC & APFCB). The Secretary informed the members that once it is approved and passed by the GB then the Constitution will have to be modified and membership criteria will have to change to reflect the new character of the association. The GB approved the new name. The GB authorized the Secretary to add the changes in the constitution and have the amended constitution sent to the Registrar of Cooperative Societies wher it was first registered, i.e. PATNA.

3. The Secretary placed informed the General Body regarding the proposal received from Prof. R. L. Mattoo (Past President, Jammu Conference) for starting an award in his name in the field of Analytical Biochemistry/Methodologies category. He informed members that Dr Mattoo is willing to contribute 2.0 lacs for starting a corpus for this award. The GB approved this proposal and agreed to start a Poster Awards as

- 4. The General Secretary, ACBI informed honorable members about the EC agreeing to his proposal to take steps to increase the involvement of young association members in the activities of ACBI and also to start a YOUNG SCIENTISTS FORUM. Members suggested that a small committee of 2 to 3 young scientists with Dr Prasenjit Mitra (PGIMER, Chandigarh) as chair be formed. They would be requested to define ways & means to achieve this goal.
- 5. The Secretary then informed the members of the GB regarding the approval given by the EC to present the SOP for hosting the ACBI Zonal Conferences. Giving the background to the members about ACBI Zonal Conferences, which are being conducted by the different Zones of our association. He explained that due to a lack

-0-0-0<del>-</del>

of guidelines, many organizers organize it just like a National Conference, holding it for 2 – 3 days and inviting people from all over the country to participate. Dr Rajiv Sinha explained that the members of the EC had suggested that Zonal conferences should preferably be of 1 day duration and as far as possible members from the same zone should be invited. With this background, an SOP for the conduct of ACBI Zonal Conferences was drawn up and circulated. All the members present approved the SOP for zonal conferences and requested the Secretary to incorporate it into the ACBI constitution.

The GB was informed that at the Pre-GB Executive council meeting held on the 4th, Points were raised regarding conduct of our National conference especially related to finance. It was pointed out that many organizing secretaries have been taking refundable advance from ACBI Head Office and then showing a deficit at the final accounting stage. Members were pained and expressed unhappiness on this state of affair. They had suggested that either the General Secretary or Treasurer should always be a part of the conference organizing committee and one of them should be a Co-Signatory to all payments made. Cash dealing should be completely prohibited. The Secretary was requested to explore the option of having the conference account under the eyes of ACBI Head office.

A few Past Presidents pointed out that ACBI is the only National Body which allows free registration and accommodation to all its EB members & Past presidents. Members pointed out that in other conferences everyone has to pay registration fees including the President & Secretary. Because of this those societies are not so desperate for fundings. It was suggested that we can also do this in our national conference, i.e. All EC members have to pay registration charges. It was also suggested that Invited speakers should be offered 2 nights stay & free registration (as done internationally). The GB approved this suggestion and passed it for implementation from next conference.

- 7. The Secretary informed the members that Dr Jawahar Kalra, receipient of the Dr. T. N. Pattabiraman Oration has donated the amount he received to the ACBI Benovolent Fund. All members presented applauded this gesture and thanked Dr Kalra for his generous donation.
- 8. The Secretary, Dr. Rajiv R Sinha placed before the EC, the applications received in response to the notification given in the ACBI News bulletin to fill the post of one Vice-President, Joint Secretary (HQ) and State Representatives. The following were the members who were elected for the different posts in the EC for the year 2025:
- 1. Vice President- Dr Harsh Vardhan Sinha (Delhi)
- 2. Joint Secretary-

President's Office – Dr Jyotdeep Kaur (Chandigarh) Head Quarters – Dr Deepak Parchwani (Rajkot)

3. State Representative

West Bengal – Dr. Asmita Hazra (Kalyani)

Maharashtra – Dr. Anurodh Gupta

Uttar Pradesh - Dr. Ranjana Singh (Lucknow)

Gujrat - Dr. Sandya Pillai Nair (Ahmedabad)

Rest of the State Representatives sent their consent to remain for 2025.

9. With the permission of the Chair, the secretary informed the house that inspite of being present in the venue, certain members of the Executive Board are absenting themselves from the meetings of the association. He said that we only meet once a year and we decide the course of action of our association for the whole year. The GB members deplored this attitude and requested the Secretary or see that this does not happen again.

The Executive Council recorded its appreciation on the excellent leadership provided by Dr Kannan Vaidyanathan, the President during the year 2024, in carrying out the activities of ACBI.

The President thanked the members for their active participation in this very important meeting.

The meeting ended with a Vote of Thanks proposed by the Secretary.

(Dec. 7, 2024, 11:00 a.m. Venue: Hotel Mount View, Chandigarh)




# 1<sup>st</sup>. Annual Chhattisgarh State Conference

The 1st Annual Chhattisgarh State Chapter of Association of Clinical Biochemists of India was conducted by the Department of Biochemistry, All India Institute of Medical Sciences Raipur on 30th January 2025. The theme of this conference was 'Interdisciplinary Research: Shaping the Healthcare of the Future'. Speakers from different institutes across Chhattisgarh presented their research work with an aim to bridge the gap between the bench and bedside. The speakers spoke on recent advances on topics of identifying targets for treatment of disease like Alzheimer's which is a progressive neurodegenerative disease with no treatment. There was also a diagnostic potential of complement components and the role of AI and machine learning in drug discovery as the newer modes of diagnosis which can serve to transform healthcare.

#### **ADMISSIBILITY RULES**

**ASSOCIATE MEMBERSHIP:** Those graduates who do not fit in the above criteria, but have an interest in Clinical Biochemistry are eligible to become Associate Members.

**CORPORATE MEMBERSHIP:** A company dealing in biochemical and instruments for biochemistry laboratories can become corporate members.

#### **MEMBERSHIP FEE:**
