Dr Kaushal. K. Srivastava

(February 4, 1940 – April 29, 2021)

We are very saddened to hear of the demise of our senior fellow colleague, **Dr. Kaushal Kishor Srivastava** on behalf of the ACBI family, we wish to convey our sincere condolences to his family, friends, professional colleagues, juniors and students and pray to the almighty that his soul may rest in peace. We are sorry to have lost such a dynamic & senior ACBI member from our biochemistry community due to covid-19.

Dr. Srivastava served as Professor Emeritus at B.R. Ambedkar Centre of Biomedical Research, Delhi University and an Emeritus Scientist of Defence Research Development Organization (DRDO), Ministry of Defence, Govt. of India. He superannuated as Director, Directorate of Biomedical Sciences (DBAS), DRDO Hg. and Director (Projects) at defence Institute of Physiology & Allied Sciences at New Delhi and was Deputy Director and Head of the Department of Biochemistry which, included Biochemical Pharmacology, Immunomodulation in addition to Biochemistry. He also supervised the activities of Human Engineering and Audio Sonics Groups. Dr. Srivastava obtained his M.Sc. (Biochemistry) from University of Lucknow in 1960, in first Division & first in the order of merit and Ph.D. (Biochemistry) from Vallabh Bhai Patel (V.P.) Chest Institute, University of Delhi, Delhi. He also obtained Masters Diploma in Public Administration from Indian Institute of Public Administration, New Delhi in 1983 demonstrating his versatility keeping up with the demands of the times. Dr. Srivastava was currently the President, ACBI Delhi Chapter and conducted its Academic activities with full vigor and zeal. ACBI would always be grateful to him vis - a- vis his functional activities to fulfill its aims and objectives. He was playing a great role at various levels in National association and was also the Chairman, Scientific committee of ACBICON 2007 held in IHC, Delhi. He was awarded Dr. Taranath Shetty oration Award of ACBI which he delivered at Goa conference in 2016 on HAPPINESS. One of his latest book was published on " Biological Stress and its management by Mittal Publications, New Delhi. The emphasis of the book was on Stress Management using "Adaptogens" along with other modalities. His major discovery relates to the genetic markers for high altitude pulmonary susceptibility in lowlanders. He was also awarded by Honorable Prime Minister of India for his excellent services as director.

The ACBI and Community of biochemists in India mourns on the passing away of **Dr. Kaushal. K. Srivastava**. His presence will be immensely missed. We pray to the almighty that his soul may rest in peace and his near and dear one's in the family are given enough courage to bear this irreparable loss of the family.

The nomination should clearly give information about proposed nominee regarding his/her achievement, qualification, position and some reference about the field of work.

[1] AWADHESH SARAN MEMORIAL ORATION AWARD

This oration was started in 1978 to commemorate the Founder President, Dr. Awadhesh Saran, who died prematurely in 1976. An eminent scientist is invited to deliver a lecture on a subject of interest to the clinical biochemists. The speaker may or may not be a biochemist or a member of ACBI or Indian national.

[2] K. L. GUPTA MEMORIAL ORATION AWARD

The Oration was started in 1993 by Dr T. Malati and her brothers by donating a sum of Rs. 40,000 and again donating Rs. 50,000 in 2011. The nominee should be an eminent scientist working in the field of Oncology. He/She may or may not be member of ACBI or an Indian National.

[3] K. E. M. HOSPITAL AND SETH G. S. MEDICAL COLLEGE ORATION

This oration was started in 1992 by the then Organizing Secretary, Dr. A. V. Potnis, Prof. of Biochemistry of K.E.M. Hospital & Seth G.S. Medical College, Bombay by donating a sum of Rs. 15,000=00 from savings of the conference. Dr. Sucheta Dandekar, Professor of Biochemistry, Seth G.S. Medical College, Mumbai has further added Rs. 15,000/ from the savings of a Workshop on Quality Management held in December 2005 at Seth G.S. Medical College, Mumbai and also donated Rs. 1.0 lacs from savings of ACBICON 2010 at Mumbai. The nominee should be an eminent Biochemist/Pathologist/Clinician/Scientist to give a lecture on topic related to Clinical Biochemistry. He/She may or may not be member of ACBI or an Indian National.

[4] Dr. T. N. Pattabhiraman Oration

This oration was created in year 2004 in the name Dr. T. N. Pattabhiraman, Ex-Professor of Biochemistry, Kasturba Medical College, Manipal and Past President of ACBI, by donation of Rs. One lakh and one thousand by his admiring students. The oration will take place annually during ACBI National Conference.

The **Award** nominee should be an eminent Biochemist/Pathologist/Clinician/Scientist to give a lecture on topic related to Clinical Biochemistry. He/She may or may not be member of ACBI or an Indian National.

[5] Mrs. & Dr. G. P. Talwar Oration

This Oration was created in 2005 by a donation by Dr. G. P. Talwar Foundation of Rs. one lac. Dr. G. P. Talwar is a renowned Biochemist who was Head of Biochemistry in All India Institute of Medical Sciences, New Delhi and later, Director of Indian Institute of Immunology, New Delhi. He was President of ACBI in the year 1982.

The **Award** nominee should be an eminent Biochemist/ Immunologist/ Pathologist/ Clinician/ Scientist to give a lecture on topic related to his research done in India in the last 5 years which is of interest to clinical biochemists. He/ She may or may not be member of ACBI or an Indian National.

CALLING ALL YOUNG DELEGATES.

ORAL PRESENTATION OF AWARD PAPERS

The Organizing Secretary shall be inviting papers for the The winner of the award shall be announce during the below mentioned Awards from members of the Association including sessional members through the final announcement of the conference and the papers should reach the Organizing Secretary by email by the date fixed for receiving papers for the conference. These papers shall be evaluated by Scientific Committee of the conference. On the basis of evaluation done by members of the scientific committee, the organizing secretary shall select 2 best papers of each award and inform their authors to present them at a special session for award papers before 3 judges selected by the President from amongst senior delegates for this purpose. Each presentation shall not be of more than 8 minutes duration. After presentation of each paper, 2 minutes shall be devoted on discussion by the judges and the audience.

The name of the best paper author of each Award, as decided by the judges, will be announce at the valedictory function and the certificate and cash prize will be sent by post. You can make yourself ready to submit your paper in time indicating the name of the award for which the paper is being submitted. Any member including Sessional Member, whose age on 31st December of the Year is below 35 years, is eligible to take part in the contest.

[1] SITA DEVI AWARD

The cash award and a certificate are given to the person whose paper in oral presentation was considered best and worth. The applicant shall submit by email (1) his/her paper, (2) documentary evidence of age (3) proof of membership of ACBI (4) no objection certificate from co-authors, if any, to the Organizing Secretary before the dead line.

[2] P. S. Murthy - Ucms Award for Best Paper In The Field of:

This was further supplemented by a donation of Rs. 49,000 from the saving of the XX Annual conference held at Delhi.

Papers for the award are invited under 4 categories, i.e. (1) Infectious Diseases, and (2) Development of Drugs (3) Diabetes and (4) Cardiovascular Diseases. One best paper in each category is awarded with certificate and cash. If no paper under one category is available or considered worth, then both awards shall go to two top papers of the other category. In case no paper in either category is considered worth, then similar papers in Poster Sessions should be considered for the award. The winner of the award shall be announced during the valedictory function and the cash award and certificate would be sent by post. The applicant shall submit (1) his/her paper, (2) documentary evidence of age (3) no objection certificate from co-authors, if any and (4) evidence of membership of ACBI, to the Organizing Secretary before the dead line. [3] MGIMS AWARD FOR BEST PAPER IN THE FIELD OF **TROPICAL DISEASES**

This award was created in the year 1994 by a donation of Rs.10,000/ by Dr. B. C. Harinath, the Organizing Secretary of 20th. ACBI conference, Sevagram. As per the resolution of the General Body passed in December 2011, Gwalior, this was further supplemented by a donation of Rs. 50,000 from the ACBI Corpus fund.

The Award is open for original work in biochemical/ immunological/ molecular aspects of Tropical Diseases. The applicant shall submit ((1) his/her paper, (2) documentary evidence of age (3) no objection certificate from co-authors, if any and (4) evidence of membership of ACBI, to the Organizing Secretary before the dead line.

In case no paper is considered worth, then similar papers in Poster Sessions should be considered for the award. The winner of the award shall be announced during the valedictory function and the cash award and certificate would be sent by post.

POSTER AWARDS

A number of awards will be granted to the best posters presented at the conference. All young scientists aged 35 year or less (on 31st. December of that year) submitting a poster at the ACBI National conference will be considered for the Poster Award Competition. No applications are required to be submitted.

[1] NIMS AWARD FOR BEST POSTER.

The award was instituted in 1994 by a donation of Rs. 10,000/ by the Organising Secretary of XIX Annual Conference of ACBI, Dr. T. Malati, Professor and Head of the Dept. of Biochemistry, Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences (NIMS), Hyderabad. As per the resolution of the General Body passed in December 2011, Gwalior, this was further supplemented by a donation of Rs. 50,000 from the ACBI Corpus fund.

There are 2 awards - One award is for the best poster in the **field of Cancer** and another in **Non-Cancer** field. <u>There is no</u> <u>application required to win this award</u>. All posters shall be evaluated by a panel of judges drawn from the delegates, who have been selected by the President in consultation with the Organizing secretary. The winner of the award shall be announced during the valedictory function and the cash award and certificate would be sent by post.

[2] Dr. P. Usha Sarma Best Poster Award in Genomic Proteonomic sciences – Clinical Application

The award was instituted in 2013 by a donation of Rs. 50,000/ by Dr. P. Usha Sharma, Retired Professor and Head ofthe Dept. of Biochemistry, Dr. B. R. Ambedkar Institute of Genomic Research, New Delhi.

NORTH ZONE ACBICON 2021



The conference was organized by the Department of Biochemistry, All India Institute of Medical Sciences, Jodhpur under aegis of Rajasthan Society for Association of Dr. Harichandra kumar K. T on "Significance of sampling and Clinical Biochemists India. The two days conference was sample size in medical research". Dr. Sucheta P. Dandekar inaugurated by Prof. Sanjeev Misra, Director, AIIMS, Jodhpur. Welcome note was delivered by the Patron Prof Learning and avenue to deep learning". The guest lectures Praveen Sharma. The two days conference was moderated by Dr. Mithu Banerjee, Dr. Dharmveer Yadav (Organizing Secretary) and Dr. Prasenjit Mitra (Organizing Secretary).

The conference brought together experts from various fields who enlightened the delegates on the emerging trends in laboratory medicine. The sessions on each day started with Guest lectures delivered by eminent experts. On 16th of April, the guest

MEMBERSHIP OF THE ASSOCIATION OF CLINICAL BIOCHEMISTS OF INDIA

ADMISSIBILITY RULES

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA: Membership of the Association is open to teachers & research scientists in the discipline of Biochemistry, Clinical Biochemistry, Immunology, Pathology, Endocrinology, Nutrition, Medicine and other allied subjects in a medical institution and also to persons holding M.B.B.S., M.Sc. (Biochemistry or Clinical Biochemistry) and are engaged in research or practice of clinical Biochemistry in hospital or in private laboratory.

ASSOCIATE MEMBERSHIP: Those graduates who do not fit in the above criteria, but have an interest in Clinical Biochemistry are eligible to become Associate Members.

CORPORATE MEMBERSHIP: A company dealing in biochemical and instruments for biochemistry laboratories can become corporate members.

SESSIONAL MEMBERSHIP: Those persons who are not members but want to attend ACBI National Conference and attend and/or present papers have to become Sessional Member. This membership will be valid for that conference only. If he/she fulfils all eligibility criteria for membership and again pays the next year Annual membership fees, they will be admitted as Annual Member of ACBI.

MEMBERSHIP FEE: (a) Annual Member – Rs. 600/- annually, (b) Life Member – Rs.5130/- (Rs.5000/- once + Rs.30/- for L.M. Certificate posting + 100/- I Card (or Rs. 1800/- annually for 3 consecutive years.) (c) For persons residing in other countries – US \$200/- (d) ASSOCIATE LIFE MEMBERS - Rs.5130/- (Rs.5000/- once + Rs.30/- for L.M. 
