

# **OBITUARY**



Dr. Bhaskar Chinnaiah Harinath
September 4, 1937 – October 22, 2022

A renowned Indian Immunologist and Biochemist, Professor Dr. B.C. Harinath, who passed away on October 22, 2022 at his native place near Tirupati at the age of 85, will always be remembered for his scientific brilliance, leadership and excellent mentorship. He was President of ACBI in 1994.

Professor Dr. B.C. Harinath in full Bhaskar Chinnaiah Harinath was born on September 4, 1937 in Kallur, Andhra Pradesh, India. He earned his Masters of Science, Biochemistry in 1961 from PG Department of Biochemistry, Nagpur University, India and obtained PhD from Oklahoma State University, USA in 1968 under Fullbright fellowship program. He worked as Research Assistant, Oklahoma State University, USA and Postdoctoral Fellow at University of Washington, St. Louis, USA. Dr. Harinath returned to India in 1970 to join the first rural medical institute of India 'Mahatma Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences (MGIMS),

Sevagram', Wardha to establish the Department of Biochemistry. He served the institute at many positions and also held the charge of Dean, MGIMS. During his stay at Sevagram, he organized many National & International Conferences, CMEs, Workshops and Training Courses. Although Dr. Harinath was superannuated in 2002 at the post of Director Professor, yet he continued serving as Honorary Professor and Director of Jamnalal Bajaj Tropical Disease Research Centre, Sevagram at MGIMS, Sevagram before returning to his native place Tirupati in Andhra Pradesh, India in 2017.

Apart from being a great teacher, he established himself as global scientist with his hard-working capacity, professional integrity, sincerity, daring to dream big and accomplish it and dedication towards research. Under his leadership and guidance in academics, patients' care and research, the Jamnalal Bajaj Tropical Disease Research Centre (JBTDRC), an advanced centre for Tropical Disease Research established was established in 1994 at MGIMS Sevagram to expand the Institute's ongoing research programmes in tropical diseases such as filariasis and tuberculosis prevalent in this region. It was the result of sustained problem based research activity in Department of Biochemistry at MGIMS with support from Unichem labs, USEFI, ICMR, CSIR, DST, WHO/ TDR, INDO US-STI and DBT. The Centre was also recognized and funded by DBT for establishment of 'National Repository' for filarial parasites and reagents and Bioinformatics Centre one of the 146 Centers in India. With his caveat hard work, determination and dedication towards research, he demonstrated that rural location of the Institute is no deterrent to the development of scientific

excellence. Widely known for his research in filaria and tuberculosis diagnostics, his most significant scientific contribution was the in-house development of ELISA based Immunoscreening tests for filariasis and tuberculosis. He travelled across the globe participating in International Seminars and Workshops at USA, Kenya, Australia, USSR, Malaysia, France, Singapore, Thailand, Brazil, China etc. He mentored and guided 17 PhD and 8 MD students and made them excellent leaders in their respective research domains. He produced more than 200 National and International research publications. He was instrumental in isolation of Mycobacterial ES-31 serine protease (SEVA TB ES-31 antigen) of diagnostic and drug target interest and biomarker, reported for the first time and patented the findings.

His research work was recognized by Amrut Modi award (1986, Unichem Labs), PA Kurup Endowment award (1991, SBC), Awadesh Saran Oration (1992, ACBI), Dr. B. C. Roy National award (1992, MCI), Dhanwantri award (2004, Education Society, Wardha) and AJ Thakur Award for Distinguished Clinical Biochemist of India (2009, ACBI). Dr. Harinath also served as President, Indian Immunology Society (1990-92) and Association of Clinical Biochemists of India (1994-95). Also, he was Member of various National & International Scientific bodies: Science Advisory Group Division Basic Medical Sciences and Traditional Medicine, Indian Council of Medical Research, Council for Scientific and Industrial Research Medical Science Research Committee, Dialectical Behavior Therapy Task Force Medical Biotechnology, Vipassana Research Council, Igatpuri, Indian Immunology Society, Association Clinical Biochemists of India, New York Academy of Sciences, Society Biological Chemists India, Royal Society of Tropical Medicine & Hygiene, American Association Clinical Chemistry (Grantee International Travel). He also served as an Advisor to World Health Organization expert advisory panel on health laboratory services and Indian Association of Medical Informatics. Dr. B.C. Harinath was listed as a noteworthy biochemistry educator, researcher by Marquis Who's who.

Post superannuation, he was more devoted towards social work and was instrumental in establishing Arogyadham at MGIMS, Sevagram (supported by KHS and CCRYN) with Yoga & Nature Cure Centre & Herbal Garden and later at his native place Tirupati, he also established Arogyavihar, a holistic center and remained there as keen active member till his last breath.

He is survived by his beloved wife Madam Vimla Harinath, sons Dr. Ashok Harinath & Mr. Anil Harinath and family members.

The writer of this brief note has special reason to feel the loss of Professor Dr. Harinath as he was mentored by him for MD course and close association in several research projects in tuberculosis & cancer and in establishing the Bioinformatics Centre at this institute.

**Dr Udayan Ray** 

It is with sadness we announce the passing of Clinical Associate Professor Udayan Ray who died in Kolkata, India, Thursday the 28th of November 2019.

Clinical Associate Professor Udayan Ray attained his medical degree at the University of Kolkata in 1980. His further training included Biochemistry, completing a Doctorate of Medicine in Clinical Biochemistry in 1986.

Dr Ray spent time as a Chemical Pathologist in Papua New Guinea before moving to Australia. He joined the AACB in1992 and achieved an FAACB in 1995 then FRCPA in 1996.

Dr Ray worked at Royal Hobart Hospital from 2003 until his death, and was tireless in his commitment to medical student education, as well as scientist training, in addition to his clinical research interests in insulin resistance and nitric oxide in ischemic heart disease and malignancy.

Udayan was well known to scientists and chemical pathologists for his enthusiasm and need to ask further questions. He was actively involved in the activities of the association and took part in every ACBI National Conference. He passed away after a short illness, and will be missed by colleagues and friends in the Association.



The 48th annual conference of the Association of Clinical Biochemists of India, ACBICON 2022, was held at the ICAR Convention Center in New Delhi, India from 24th to 26th November, 2022, on the theme "Harnessing Basic and Molecular Research to Enhance Patient Care". The clinically oriented state-of-the-art preconference workshops were held on the 22nd and 23rd of November, 2022. It is extremely gratifying to welcome such an august gathering from different parts of India to attend the 48th Annual national conference of the Association of Clinical Biochemists of India being held in Delhi.

I feel so happy to be able to come before you all to deliver the Annual report of the activities of the Association of Clinical Biochemists of India for the year 2022. Though we had an offline/online hybrid National conference in 2021 at Kolkata but nothing can compare to meeting you all in person after the 2019 APFCB Jaipur conference. The conference was attended by over 800 delegates in both the partial offline mode and major online mode. Over 600 delegates attended this from all over the world. The congress had a heavy schedule with Six pre-congress workshops, three plenary lectures and 4 ACBI Orations. The scientific program of the Congress had 24 symposia containing 134 lectures presented on emerging topics of clinical biochemistry and laboratory medicine, AFMC Quiz and 9 Industrial workshop/symposia. 236 Posters were presented.


#### INDIAN JOURNAL OF CLINICAL BIOCHEMISTRY

# MINUTES OF THE 48th PRE-GB EXECUTIVE COUNCIL MEETING

(ICAR Convention Center, Delhi, November 23, 2022)

The Executive Council (EC) of ACBI met on October 23rd. 2022 at 6.00 pm in the Meeting room of ICAR Convention Center, Delhi. The Executive Council meeting was presided over by Dr. Subir Kumar Das, President ACBI. The meeting started with all members observing a 2 minutes silence in the memory of two of our senior member, Dr B. C. Harinath who passed away on 22nd. October 2022 and also, Dr. Udayan Ray who had passed away on 28th. November 2019. Dr. Rajiv R Sinha, General Secretary of ACBI presented the minutes of the previous EC meeting and the same was accepted by the council. Dr Rajiv R Sinha, General Secretary, presented the Annual Report of the association for the year 2022. Accounts of the ACBI for the year 2021-2022 was presented by the Secretary, Dr. R. R. Sinha as the Treasurer had to cancel his meeting due to a sudden family problem. The Secretary, on behalf of the treasurer, sought an apology from the members present as the report could not be handed over to him. He requested the EC to allow him to send the Treasurer's report by email to all present. The EC accepted his request.

On behalf of the Treasurer the Secretary informed members present about the current state of affairs of the association accounts. The association has 1 current account and multiple saving bank accounts in SBI & PNB. These saving bank accounts were opened as & when members of the association & or Organizing secretaries donated monies to start an oration or award. He informed that each & every account has to undergo KYC formalities every year leading to an unnecessary amount of paperwork. Our associations Chartered Accountant has suggested to close all Saving Bank accounts & FD and deposit the amount into the Current Account. Since the amount of award money in each award is known, it will become easy to maintain our account. The Secretary requested the EC members for their approval for this to which all EC members present agreed.

Dr. Subir Kumar Das submitted the final accounts of the 2021 47th. National conference held at Kolkata. The total surplus left after deducting all expenses was 3,01,813.27. As per the MOU between ACBICON 2021 & ACBI, Rs. 1.0 lacs was transferred to ACBI Corporate Wing, 1.0 lacs was transferred to ACBI W Bengal branch and Rs. 1.018 lacs was transferred to the ACBI Head office as its share of the surplus. Members thanked Dr

Subir for submitting his accounts on time before the EC.

Editor-in-Chief, Dr. Praveen Sharma, presented the report on the Indian Journal of Clinical Biochemistry and informed the members about the efforts being taken to keep the standard of IJCB high. The four issues of IJCB are being released on time. Dr. Sharma informed the EC that IJCB is being distributed to more than 9000 libraries around the world. The members were informed by the Editor-in-chief about the high regards that IJCB has generated by the increased number of citations and also downloads. Dr. Sharma requested members to send their article to be published in their own journal. EC members lauded the efforts of Dr. Praveen Sharma, his editorial team and Springer for their untiring effort to keep the IJCB's standard flying high.

The Convener of the ACBI/CMC-Vellore External Quality Assurance Program, Dr. Pamela Christudoss, presented the report on the ongoing EQA program for the year 2020-2022. She informed the EC that it is the 44th year of the CMCEQAS -Clinical biochemistry, under the Aegis of ACBI and was happy to mention that the vision and mission for which this programme had evolved 44 years ago, with 58 laboratories in 1978 has been gracefully taken forward to help the Indian labs – very small, small, medium, large, from private sector, Govt. hospital labs and even PHC'S. With increasing awareness of the importance of Quality control and External quality control in medical labs in India, the CMCEQAS has witnessed its growth in all dimensions with the increase in participating labs in the last few years and as of the year 2022 we have 11000 lab participants registered in 11 different programmes, 9 of these are accredited according to the ISO 17043:2010 standards. At this point all members thanked the Department of Clinical Biochemistry and the management for CMC, Vellore for their effort & zeal in successfully running this programme for 44 years.

Mr. Upendra Singh, Convener of the ACBI-Corporate wing presented an update of the activities of the ACBI-CW in 2022. He informed the members that one CW meeting took place during the year in which discussions took place regarding corporate sponsorship and corporate academic programme to the 48th. ACBICON 2022 at Delhi. He also presented the accounts of the Corporate wing which was accepted by the EC.

The General Secretary, Dr. Rajiv R. Sinha presented the new applications received for individual membership. He informed that in 2022, the total number of new applicants for membership was: Life member = 52, Associate Life member = 2. All the new applications were approved by the EC. The Secretary, Dr Rajiv Sinha informed the members that as of today our total Active membership strength stands at 2623, of which Life Members are 2186, Associate Life members – 245, Ordinary/Annual Members – 19, Corporate Members – 28 and Honorary Members – 2.

The nominations and the review reports received for the fellowship of ACBI were placed before the EC by the Secretary. The EC approved the recommendations of the committee to award the fellowship of ACBI to Dr Pradeep Kumar Dabla (Delhi) and Dr Abbas A. Mahdi, Past President of ACBI in the year 2018. Since Dr L. M. Srivastava, Past President had already been conferred with FACBI and hence his name was not considered.

Dr. Rajiv Sinha then placed before the EC the nominations received for different orations for 2022 and the reports of the oration award selection Committee. The EC ratified the decision of the selection committee.

The Secretary, Dr. Rajiv R Sinha placed before the EC, the applications received in response to the notification given in the ACBI News bulletin to fill the post of one Vice-President, Joint Secretary (HQ) and State Representatives. The President announced that there was two nomination for the post of Vice-President for which Dr Pradeep Kumar Dabla (Delhi) and Dr Harsh Vardhan Singh (Delhi) have applied and both their nominations are in order. One nomination of Dr Prasenjit Mitra (Chandigarh) was received for Joint Secretary (HQ). Names were received for State Representatives.

For the post of State Representative, EC validated the applications received from Delhi, Haryana, Telangana, Bihar, Maharashtra, Chandigarh, UP & west Bengal for presentation before GB The EC members were informed that Dr. Jayshree Bhattacharjee was selected as the recipient of the ACBI-A. J. Thakur Award for Distinguished Services in Clinical Biochemistry & Laboratory Medicine in 2018 during the Goa Conference. But unfortunately, a family member of the Thakur family met with a road accident in Mumbai on the day of the presentation, hence Mr. Abhinav Thakur expressed his helplessness in coming for the Award ceremony.

Subsequently, in 2019 Jaipur Conference, Dr Jayshree was unwell to come. Therefore, it was decided that this year, the award slated for 2018 may be given to Dr Jayshree Bhattacharjee.

The EC was informed by the secretary that request for organizing 49th. ACBI Natinal conference in 2023 was approved by the EC (Online) in 2021 & was awarded to Dr Kannan Vaidyanathan who proposed to hold in Thiruvananthapuram. He was requested to appear before the EC during the Delhi conference and reiterate his position to host the 2023 conference. Dr Kannan has reiterated his position to organize the 2023 ACBICON in Kerala and was accepted by the EC. The Secretary informed the EC that application were also received from Dr. Indu Verma (PGI, Chandigarh) for 2024, Dr. Sadanand Naik (Pune) also for 2024 and Dr Mingma Lhamu Sherpa (SMIMS, Gangtok) for 2026. All the applications were approved and were to be placed before the GB for discussion and approval.

Dr. D. M. Vasudevan, Past President & Director, Indian Board of Clinical Biochemistry, presented a report on the progress of the Membership course of the Association. The course was started on 1st January 2013. The syllabus was approved by the ACBI. The course is for 3 years, with 30 topics. The positive side is that we have developed the course content; the reading material, the question bank etc. It will be easy for any course director to conduct the course for the coming batches. The EC members were requested to suggest way and means to popularize this course. The members expressed thanks to Dr Vasudevan and his whole team for running this flagship course of ACBI smoothly and successfully.

The Secretary placed before the EC issues related to Agenda for the 48th. Annual GB meeting. The Draft copy was placed before EC for its consideration & review. The EC approved of the agenda.

The Executive Council recorded its appreciation on the excellent leadership provided by Dr Subir Das, the President during the year 2021, in carrying out the activities of ACBI.

The meeting ended with a Vote of Thanks proposed by the secretary.

# MINUTES OF THE 48th. ANNUAL GENERAL BODY MEETING

ICAR Convention Centre, Delhi, November 23rd. 2022, 5.30 pm)

The 48th. General Body (GB) meeting of the Association of Clinical Biochemists of India (ACBI) was held on November 23rd, 2022, at 5:30 PM in Hall-A of the ICAR Convention Centre, Delhi. The meeting was presided over by Dr Seema Bhargava, President ACBI. The President informed all members present that Dr Rajiv R Sinha, Secretary ACBI has informed her that he will be unable to participate in the General Body Meeting due to the illness of his father, Dr. K. P. Sinha. He has expressed regret and has requested President ACBI to allow Dr. Prasenjit Mitra, Joint Secretary (HQ) to help conduct the meeting.

The meeting started with all members observing a two minutes silence in the memory of two of our senior members, Dr B C Harinath and Dr Udayan Ray.

**Dr. B C Harinath**, Past President of ACBI in 1994, was born on September 4, 1937. He was a renowned Indian Immunologist and Biochemist and passed away on October 22, 2022 at his native place near Tirupati at the age of 85. He will always be remembered for his scientific brilliance, leadership and excellent mentorship.

He earned his Masters of Science, Biochemistry in 1961 from PG Department of Biochemistry, Nagpur University, India and obtained PhD from Oklahoma State University, USA in 1968 under Fullbright fellowship program. He worked as Research Assistant, Oklahoma State University, USA and Postdoctoral Fellow at University of Washington, St. Louis, USA. Dr. Harinath returned to India in 1970 to join the first rural medical institute of India 'Mahatma Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences (MGIMS), Sevagram', Wardha to establish the Department of Biochemistry. He served the institute at many positions and also held the charge of Dean, MGIMS. During his stay at Sevagram, he organized many National & International Conferences, the 1993 ACBI National Conference being one, CMEs, Workshops and Training Courses. Although Dr. Harinath was superannuated in 2002 at the post of Director Professor, yet he continued serving as Honorary Professor and Director of Jamnalal Bajaj Tropical Disease Research Centre, Sevagram at MGIMS, Sevagram before returning to his native place Tirupati in Andhra Pradesh, India in 2017. Apart from being a great teacher, he established himself as global scientist with his hardworking capacity, professional integrity, sincerity, daring to dream big and accomplish it and dedication towards research. Under his leadership and guidance in academics, patients' care and research, the Jamnalal Bajaj Tropical Disease Research

Centre (JBTDRC), an advanced centre for Tropical Disease Research was established in 1994 at MGIMS Sevagram to expand the Institute's ongoing research programmes in tropical diseases such as filariasis and tuberculosis prevalent in this region. It was the result of sustained problem based research activity in Department of Biochemistry at MGIMS with support from Unichem labs, USEFI, ICMR, CSIR, DST, WHO/ TDR, INDO US-STI and DBT. The Centre was also recognized and funded by DBT for establishment of 'National Repository' for filarial parasites and reagents and Bioinformatics Centre, one of the 146 Centers in India. With his caveat hard work, determination and dedication towards research, he demonstrated that rural location of the Institute is no deterrent to the development of scientific excellence. Widely known for his research in filaria and tuberculosis diagnostics, his most significant scientific contribution was the in-house development of ELISA based Immunoscreening tests for filariasis and tuberculosis. He mentored and guided 17 PhD and 8 MD students and made them excellent leaders in their respective research domains. He produced more than 200 National and International research publications. He was instrumental in isolation of Mycobacterial ES-31 serine protease (SEVA TB ES-31 antigen) of diagnostic and drug target interest and biomarker, reported for the first time and patented the findings.

His research work was recognized by Amrut Modi award (1986, Unichem Labs), PA Kurup Endowment award (1991, SBC), Awadesh Saran Oration (1992, ACBI), Dr. B. C. Roy National award (1992, MCI), Dhanwantri award (2004, Education Society, Wardha) and AJ Thakur Award for Distinguished Clinical Biochemist of India (2009, ACBI). Dr. Harinath also served as President, Indian Immunology Society (1990-92) and Association of Clinical Biochemists of India (1994-95).

Post superannuation, he was more devoted towards social work and was instrumental in establishing Arogyadham at MGIMS, Sevagram (supported by KHS and CCRYN) with Yoga & Nature Cure Centre & Herbal Garden and later at his native place Tirupati, he also established Arogyavihar, a holistic center and remained there as keen active member till his last breath.

#### **Dr.Udayan Ray**

It is with sadness we announce the passing of Clinical Associate Professor Udayan Ray who died in Kolkata, India on Thursday the 28th of November 2019. Professor Udayan Ray attained his medical degree at the University of Kolkata in 1980. His further training included Biochemistry, completing a Doctorate of Medicine in Clinical Biochemistry in 1986.

Dr Ray spent time as a Chemical Pathologist in Papua New Guinea before moving to Australia. He joined the AACB in1992 and achieved an FAACB in 1995 then FRCPA in 1996.

Dr Ray worked at Royal Hobart Hospital from 2003 until his death, and was tireless in his commitment to medical student education, as well as scientist training, in addition to his clinical research interests in insulin resistance and nitric oxide in ischemic heart disease and malignancy. He was well known to scientists and chemical pathologists for his enthusiasm and need to ask further questions. He was actively involved in the activities of the association and took part in every ACBI National Conference. He passed away after a short illness, and will be missed by colleagues and friends in the Association.

The Joint Secretary presented the report of the EC regarding the applications received for hosting the 2023 National conference. Proposals had been received last year for hosting the 2023 ACBICON from Dr. Kannan Vaidyanathan, Professor & Head, Department of Biochemistry, Believers Church Medical College Hospital, Thiruvalla, Kerala and was accepted with a proviso that he should re-confirm his bid in Delhi in 2022. Dr. Kannan has sent a confirmation letter for hosting it in 2023 in Thiruvananthapuram.

His proposal has been vetted by the Executive Board and is in order. The house unanimously decided to hold the 49th. 2023 Annual National Conference in Kerala with Dr. Kannan Vaidyanathan as organizing secretary. The house was informed that the conference would be held sometime in 2nd – 3rd. week of September 2023. He gave an audio-visual presentation on the ACBICON 2023 and extended warm invitation to everyone to participate in the Conference. He was requested by the President to be in constant touch with members of the ACBI Congress & Conference division for continuous guidance.

The Joint Secretary presented the report of the EC regarding the applications received for hosting the 2024 National conference. Among the nominations that were received for hosting the Annual National Conferences of subsequent years, PGIMER Chandigarh, under the leadership of Prof Indu Verma, was approved for hosting the 50th Annual National Conference of the Association in 2024. (ACBICON 2024). However, the organizing team needs to re-confirm their bid during EC meeting at the ACBICON 2023 in Kerala.

A nomination was received from Dr Sadanand Naik (Pune) for hosting the ACBI National Conference in Pune in 2025 - ACBICON 2025. The House preliminarily approved the application of Dr Sadanand Naik for 2025.

A nomination for hosting the National Confrence in 2026 at Gangtok, Sikkim was also received from Dr Mingma Lhamu Sherpa, Professor & Head Biochemistry at Sikkim Manipal Institute of Medical Sciences, Gangtok (SMIMS). It was preliminarily approved for ACBICON 2026.

The GB was informed of the important decisions taken at the EC meeting held on November 23rd. The GB ratified the decisions taken during the 48th. Pre-GB EC meeting as noted below.

The GB took up the matter related to the election of the office bearers of the Association, one Vice-President, one Joint Secretary (HQ) and State Representatives was taken up for discussion. 

We are pleased to announce a Call for Applications for a limited number of IFCC Professional Exchange Programmes (PEP) awards to support training of young scientists and continuing education of other laboratory professionals at clinical laboratory centres and IVD facilities around the world.

As part of this new expanded programme, IFCC has developed a list of clinical laboratories willing to host visiting scientists for a period of 1-3 months. (https://www.ifcc.org/media/480014/ifcc-pep-hosting-labs.pdf). A host laboratory is eligible to sponsor/host no more than 2 applicants in each Call for Application cycle (Spring or Fall of each year).

However, applicants are free to select other hosting laboratories pending prior acceptance and approval by the host. The purpose of PEP is to promote international co-operation between laboratories, facilitate the exchange of laboratory scientists between IFCC member societies, share high level scientific or management skills and introduce new or improved scientific or management skills to the applicant's laboratory. Applicants should be nominated by their own national societies. The PEP consists of two distinct programs:

- Professional Scientific Exchange Programme (PSEP) to exchange or develop high-level scientific information or skills
- Professional Management Exchange Programme (PMEP) to develop appropriate quality management skills to improve the performance and quality of service offered to patients by the base laboratory.

Applicants for an IFCC professional exchange programme will:

- Be a member of an IFCC Full Member or Affiliate Member national society
- Haven't received funding from IFCC for other PEPs
- Have a specific project to complete in a designated host laboratory
- Have the written support of:
  - The head of department in which he/she is based
  - The head of the host laboratory to be visited
  - The national society of which he/she is a member

Successful applicants will be entitled to receive:

- Economy return travel expenses from his/her home base to the host laboratory.
- Subsistence at the rate of 1500 Swiss Francs per month for a minimum of 1 month and a maximum of three months.

Applicants are required to complete the attached application form. The completed application and the supporting documents should be sent by email to the IFCC Office (ifcc@ifcc.org) by no later than May 5th 2023.


