

Greetings.



Prof. Aditi Sen who passed away in Kolkata, India on Thursday, the 18th of May 2023. Dr Sen did her Chemistry Honors from Raja Rammohan College, class of 1968 and subsequently completed her Masters and Ph.D. from University of Calcutta. She served RK Mission Seva Pratishtan Hospital from 1978 to 2007, retiring as Professor. Subsequently working as Consultant Biochemist at Theism Ultrasound Center till her sad demise.

She was a stalwart of the association who along with Prof. K. L. Mukherjee helped to establish the associations footprint in West Bengal. As long as she was able to, she did not miss a single ACBI conference, travelling the length and breadth of the country with her group of 4 to 5 diehard members. She was a guide & mentor to many biochemists in Kolkata. May her soul rest in peace.

49TH ACBICON 2023 KERALA 13 September 2023 to 16th September 2023

"Laboratory Medicine Path Ahead-Amalgamating Technology and Humanity"

CONFERENCE REPORT

The 49th ACBICON 2023 was organized in Kerala by the Association of Clinical Biochemists of India (ACBI) and the Believers Church Medical College. Themed "Laboratory Medicine Path Ahead -Amalgamating Technology and Humanity", it attracted around 1,000 biochemists and medical lab professionals nationwide. The conference, which offered sessions like keynotes, symposia, and workshops, aimed to provide an enriching platform for experts to share knowledge and advancements in clinical biochemistry. For the first time, ACBI opened its exhibition to the public. 49th ACBI also collaborated with global entities like the IFCC and APFCB to ensure international standards were maintained. The inaugural ceremony on 14 September 2023 was marked by addresses from key personalities. The ceremony commenced with a warm welcome address by the Organizing Secretary, 49th

ACBICON 2023 Dr. Kannan Vaidyanathan. He extended

gratitude to all the attendees and highlighted the importance of the event. Followed by, Dr. Seema Bhargava, the president, Association of Clinical Biochemistry of India, stressed the gathering's significance.

The General Secretary, Association of Clinical Biochemistry of India, Dr. Rajiv Ranjan Sinha provided an annual report of the year 2022, detailing the association's accomplishments. The CEO and Director of Believers Church Medical College, Dr. George Chandy Matteethra, highlighted the growing collaboration between the institutions. The ceremony was further honored by the presence of the former Hon. Health Minister, Smt. K.K. Shailaja Teacher, as the Chief Guest. Talwar Oration: Dr. Medha Rajappa, Additional Professor of Biochemistry Department of Biochemistry Jawaharlal Institute of Postgraduate Medical Education & Research (JIPMER), Dhanvantari Nagar, Puducherry, delved into biomarker signatures of inflammatory skin diseases, emphasizing their importance in refining treatment approaches.













Sessions

Additionally, embracing the digital age, Prof Tomris Ozben, President of the European Federation of Clinical Chemistry

and Laboratory Medicine (EFLM) and President Elect of the International Federation of Clinical Chemistry and Laboratory Medicine (IFCC) presented virtually on the advancements in oncology diagnostics, emphasizing the shift from traditional tumor markers to liquid biopsies. Several parallel sessions highlighted international speakers. It is extremely gratifying to welcome such an august gathering from different parts of India and abroad to God's Own Country to attend the 49th Annual national conference of the Association of Clinical Biochemists of India being held in Thiruvananthapuram.



MINUTES OF THE 49th PRE-GB EXECUTIVE COUNCIL MEETING

(September 13, 2023, 4:30 p.m. Al-Saj Convention centre, Trivandrum)

The Executive Council (EC) of ACBI met on September, 13, 2023 at 4.30 pm in the Meeting room of Al-Saj Convention Center, Trivandrum. The Executive Council meeting was presided over by Dr. Seema Bhargava, President ACBI.

The meeting started with all members observing a 2 minutes' silence in the memory of Prof. Aditi Sen who passed away recently in Kolkata, India, Thursday the 18th of May 2023. She was a stalwart of the association who along with Prof. K. L. Mukherjee helped to establish the associations footprint in West Bengal. As long as she was able to, she did not miss a single ACBI conference, travelling the length and breadth of the country with her group of 4 to 5 diehard members. She was a guide & mentor to many biochemists in Kolkata.

Dr. Rajiv R Sinha, General Secretary of ACBI presented the minutes of the previous EC meeting and the same was accepted by the council. Dr Rajiv R Sinha, General Secretary, presented the Annual Report of the association for the year 2023. Accounts of the ACBI for the year 2022-2023 was presented by the Secretary, Dr. R. R. Sinha as the Treasurer had to cancel his meeting due to his sudden illness. On behalf of the Treasurer the Secretary informed members present about the current state of affairs of the association accounts. The association has 1 current account and multiple saving bank accounts in SBI & PNB. These saving bank accounts were opened as & when members of the association & or Organizing secretaries donated monies to start an oration or award. The President announced that there was two nominations for the post of Vice-President for which Dr Shailja Sharma (Jodhpur) and Dr Harsh Vardhan Singh (Delhi) have applied and both their nominations are in order. One nomination of Dr Prasenjit Mitra (Chandigarh) was received for Joint Secretary (HQ). Names were received for State Representatives.

For the post of State Representative, EC validated the applications received from Delhi, Haryana, Telangana, Bihar, Maharashtra, Chandigarh, UP & west Bengal for presentation before GB

The EC members were informed that the award committee has recommended the name of Dr Rajendra Prasad, Ex-Prof. & Head, Department of Biochemistry, PGIMER, Chandigarh for this award for the year 2023.

The EC was informed by the secretary that request for organizing 50th. ACBI National conference in 2024 was approved by the EC in 2022 & was awarded to Dr Indu Verma who proposed to hold in Chandigarh. She was requested to appear before the EC during the Trivandrum conference and reiterate her position to host the 2024 conference. Dr Indu has reiterated her position to organize the 2024 ACBICON in Chandigarh by the department of

Biochemistry, PGIMER and it was accepted by the EC. The Secretary informed the EC that application was also received from Dr. Sadanand Naik (Pune) for 2025, Dr Mingma Lhamu Sherpa (SMIMS, Gangtok) for 2026 and AIIMS, Jodhpur for 2027. All the applications were approved and were to be placed before the GB for discussion and approval.

Dr. D. M. Vasudevan, Past President & Director, Indian Board of Clinical Biochemistry, presented a report on the progress of the Membership course of the Association. The course was started on 1st January 2013. The syllabus was approved by the ACBI. The course is for 3 years, with 30 topics.

In the first batch 8 candidates have completed their course. Through successive batches, a total of 35 persons were enrolled, but only 20 students have completed their course. After the covid pandemic, in 2022 one student completed the course. Later one more completed the course. 3 new students have joined recently. The progress of the students during periodic monthly assessment so far has been satisfactory. Dr Vasudevan thanked Dr Kannan for ably assisting him in the day to day running of the course. The members expressed thanks to Dr Vasudevan and his whole team for running this flagship course of ACBI smoothly and successfully.

As had been the practice, the secretary placed before the EC members the proposal to honor members who have worked hard to hold various academic activities under the banner of ACBI. This year the Award of Best Zonal Representative of ACBI goes to Dr Dharamveer Yadav, Zonal Representative, North Zone and for Best State Representative to Dr Mamta Kankara (Delhi).

The Secretary informed the members of the EC that he had received suggestions from members to expand the role & horizon of our association. He explained that our role as Clinical Biochemists has undergone a vast change over the years. It was suggested that we should add the word "Laboratory Medicine" to our name, ACBI. He informed all about such an addition to the names of the International societies like IFCC - International Federation of Clinical Chemistry & Laboratory Medicine, APFCB - Asian-Pacific Federation of Clinical Biochemistry & Laboratory Medicine and AACC - Association for Diagnostic & Laboratory Medicine (ADLM). 

MINUTES OF THE 49th. ANNUAL GENERAL BODY MEETING

(September 15, 2023, 4:30 p.m. Al-Saj Convention centre, Trivandrum)

The 49th. General Body (GB) meeting of the Association of Clinical Biochemists of India (ACBI) was held on September 15th. 2023, at 4:30 PM in Al-Saj Convention Centre, Trivandrum. The meeting was presided over by Dr Kannan Vaidyanathan, President ACBI.

The meeting started with all members observing a 2 minutes' silence in the memory of Prof. Aditi Sen who passed away recently in Kolkata, India, Thursday the 18th of May 2023. She was a stalwart of the association who along with Prof. K. L. Mukherjee helped to establish the associations footprint in West Bengal. As long as she was able to, she did not miss a single ACBI conference, travelling the length and breadth of the country with her group of 4 to 5 diehard members. She was a guide & mentor to many biochemists in Kolkata.

The General Secretary, Dr. Rajiv R. Sinha, placed before the house the minutes of the 48th. General Body meeting held in New Delhi under the chairmanship of Dr Seema Bhargava, which was earlier circulated through March 2023 issue of the ACBI News Bulletin. (Volume No.51/ No.-01). As there were no comments received, the minutes were approved by the house. The General Secretary presented the report of the EC regarding the applications received for hosting the 2024 National conference. Proposals had been received last year for hosting

conference. Proposals had been received last year for hosting the 2024 ACBICON from Prof. Indu Verma, Professor & Head, Department of Biochemistry, PGIMER, Chandigarh and was accepted with a proviso that she should re-confirm her bid in Trivandrum in 2023. Dr. Indu has sent a confirmation letter for hosting it in 2024 in Chandigarh. Her proposal has been vetted by the Executive Board and is in order. The house unanimously decided to hold the 50th. 2024 Annual National Conference in Chandigarh with Dr. Indu Verma as organizing secretary. The house was informed that the conference would be held sometime in 1st. week of December 2024. She gave an audiovisual presentation on the ACBICON 2024 and extended warm invitation to everyone to participate in the Conference. She was requested by the President to be in constant touch with members of the ACBI Congress & Conference division for continuous guidance.

The General Secretary presented the report of the EC regarding the applications received for hosting the 2025 National conference. Among the nominations that were received for hosting the Annual National Conferences of subsequent years, Pune, under the leadership of Dr. Sadanand Naik, was approved for hosting the 51st. Annual National Conference of the Association in 2025. (ACBICON 2025).

However, the organizing team needs to re-confirm their bid during EC meeting at the ACBICON 2024 in Chandigarh. At this point the Secretary pointed out to the GB members that if ACBI's bid to host WASPaLM in Mumbai in 2025 is approved then as has been the previous practice, the 51st Annual conference of ACBI will be held along with the WASPaLM Congress in Mumbai.

Nomination for hosting the National Conference in 2026 at Gangtok, Sikkim was received from Dr Mingma Lhamu Sherpa, Professor & Head Biochemistry at Sikkim Manipal Institute of Medical Sciences, Gangtok (SMIMS). It was preliminarily approved for ACBICON 2026. Here also, the General Secretary informed the members that our association has bid for hosting the 2026 IFCC WORLDLAB in New Delhi in October 2026. If our bid is accepted, then the 2026 National conference will also be held in conjunction with the WORLDLAB.

Nominations were also received for hosting the 2027 conference in AIIMS, Jodhpur and also from AIIMS, Bhubaneshwar for the 2028 conference.

The GB was informed of the important decisions taken at the EC meeting held on September 13th. The GB ratified the decisions taken during the 49th. Pre-GB EC meeting as noted below.

- 1. The Secretary informed the members of the EC that he had received suggestions from members to expand the role & horizon of our association. He explained that our role as Clinical Biochemists has undergone a vast change over the years. It was suggested that we should add the word "Laboratory Medicine" to our name, ACBI. He informed all about such an addition to the names of the international societies like IFCC - International Federation of Clinical Chemistry & Laboratory Medicine, APFCB – Asian-Pacific Federation of Clinical Biochemistry & Laboratory Medicine and AACC - Association for Diagnostic & Laboratory Medicine (ADLM). He requested members to give their opinion on this and also suggest as to what would be the name of our society after addition. Members were unanimous in their opinion that the word "Laboratory Medicine" may be incorporated but the abbreviation of our association should remain as "ACBI". Many names were suggested and the secretary requested the members to think over it and suggest few names
- 2. The General Secretary informed the GB of the decision of the EC to specify the term of office of the President ACBI from January to December of that year. The members were.

informed that our annual conferences are usually held during the month of November, December. But over the years we have had to hold them at different times of the year depending on local conditions. This year it is being held in September. As per our constitution, the term of office of the Executive Board & committee is from one National conference to another. The Secretary placed before the GB for their approval to define the term of office of the EB/EC from January of the year after the conference and ending on 31st. December of that year. The GB approved this proposal of the EC. The GB also authorized the General Secretary to incorporate this into the ACBI constitution.

- 3. The Secretary informed the members that our association has bid for hosting the IFCC WORLDLAB 2026 with New Delhi as the host city. He informed all present that our bid is being vetted by the IFCC C-CC and we should know the result soon.
- 4. He also informed the EC members that at the suggestion of the WASPalm Board, we had prepared and sent our bid to host the conference of WASPaLM in 2025. Since they suggested that it should preferably be held along with our National conference, we may have to change the 2025 conference from Pune to Mumbai, as Pune does not have the infrastructure to host an international congress. We also plan to invite IAPM & ACCLMP to be a part of this congress.
- 5.The General Secretary informed the honorable members that under the able leadership of Dr Praveen Sharma, Editor-in-Chief, IJCB and his team, our journal has achieved a milestone of Impact Factor of 2.1 and also has been able to earn a royalty of 19-20 lacs every year. To honour this achievement, the President presented an angrakha (shawl) to Dr Praveen Sharma. Members applauded the Dr Sharma and his team for this great achievement.
- 6. As has been the practice in the past, the Secretary announced the names of Best Zonal and State Representative of ACBI who have been at the forefront of organizing academic activities of ACBI in their areas. Dr Dharamveer Yadav was honoured for the Best Zonal Representative, North Zone; Dr Mamta Kankara was awarded the Best State Representative (Delhi).
- 7. The General Secretary informed the members that our association had submitted objections to UGMER 2023 that was published by the National Medical Commission. Many of our senior members contributed to the final letter sent to NMC. As you all must be aware, NMC withdrew the regulation and gazetted the new modified UGMER with suggestions from many sources.

8. The Secretary, Dr. Rajiv R Sinha placed before the EC, the applications received in response to the notification given in the ACBI News bulletin to fill the post of one Vice-President, Joint Secretary (HQ) and State Representatives.


The Secretary, Dr Rajiv R Sinha presented the proceedings of the previous executive council meeting held on 13th. September 2023, which was accepted.







SOUTH ZONE CONFERENCE

Department of Clinical Biochemistry, CMC Vellore - GOLDEN JUBILEE

The SOUTH ZONE ACBI CONFERENCE was organized by the department of Clinical Biochemistry and the Tamil Nadu Chapter of ACBI on the 27 & 28 Jan 2023, to mark the Golden jubilee of the department. The programme began with prayer. Dr. Pamela Christudoss, Professor & HOD welcomed the Dignitaries and the delegates and introduced the event. The dignitaries: Dr. Joy Mammen, Associate Director (Medical); Dr. Solomon Satish Kumar, Principal; Dr. Arivazhagan, HOD, Adayar Cancer Research Institute & ACBI-TN State Representative; Dr.A.S Kanagasabapathy (Former Professor & Head of Department of Clinical Biochemistry), Dr. Peter Hill, (Former Professor, Dept of Clin. Biochemistry), Dr. Raju, Deputy Director (TN State Public Health Laboratories) and Mr. N Venkateswaran, CEO, NABL - Chief guest gave their felicitations. Mr N. Venkateswaran and Dr. Raju acknowledged the Outreach service- EQAS (External Quality assurance scheme) provided by the department to the medical labs in the country.

The conference began with the Key note address of the rich experience from the stalwarts of Clinical Biochemistry-Dr. A S Kanagasabapathy & Dr. Peter Hill. The conference was well attended by 150 delegates which included MD biochemists, PhD'S, Lab managers, Quality managers from South India. Around 17 speakers inclusive of Professors from the Clinical departments in CMC and from other Medical Institutions in India and as well from overseas were invited to give the guest lectures The Clinical Biochemistry laboratory has its humble beginnings in the early 60s with the simple manual photometric methods for routine chemistries requiring large volume of patients' blood, long procedures which resulted in delayed test results. The introduction of the continuous-flow batch analyser in 1970, followed by Hitachi discrete selective analyser in 1985, Chemiluminescent technology in 1997, improved sensitivity and TAT.

The standalone Cobas Preanlaytical with Auto validation & Delta check installed in 2014 had made further improvements in efficiency. The new Cobas Connection Module (CCM) installed in 2019 with the ability of connecting the Preanalytical systems to Analytics through a fast transportation system guaranteeing quick release of results conceived for high throughput labs. Over the years the department of Clinical Biochemistry has made it possible to handle around 7000 samples per day with 195 parameters and release of approximately 25000 test results per day.

CMCEQAS under the aegis of ACBI, which is the country's first Medical External QualityAssessment Scheme has become a household name among the laboratories all over our country and neighbouring countries. The number of participating laboratories has crossed the 12000 mark with 11 programmers. The Tamil Nadu is the first state in India to enrol all their 2127 PHC's in the Basic Chemistry programme.

Dr. Pamela acknowledged the dedication and contributions of Dr. Robert Carman, Ms. Margaret Nash, and the former Heads of the department of Clinical Biochemistry. commitment of the faculty, Technical staff, Office facilitators and support staff of the Department both past & present were acknowledged. Planning and Setting up another Laboratory at the new CMC Vellore, Ranipet campus in 2022 was indeed a humongous job and was completed in record time. Our appreciation to the ACBI for giving us this opportunity and the ACBI Tamil Nadu representative for the support. Our appreciation to the NABL office & team for their positive criticisms during the various assessments which has helped in continual improvement. The department takes this opportunity to thank the Administration of CMC and to the Clinicians for their kind support & encouragement through the past 5 decades.
