Dr Chintala Sita Devi



This is to inform all members of ACBI about the sad demise of one our founder members of the association, Dr Chintala Sita Devi. She was not keeping well for sometime and passed away in her sleep on 6th March 2009.

She was one of the pillars of the Association and took active interest in its work. She regularly participated in all the conferences, except the last two because of ill health. Dr Sita Devi was an M.D. in Biochemistry, was a Fellow of the Academy of Medical Sciences and was also conferred the Fellowship of the Association in 1995. She was Professor & head at Andhra Medical College, Vishakapatnam and after retirement was working at CARE Hospital, Hyderabad.

The Association has lost a great stalwart and we pray that her soul rests in peace.



Annual Report, 2008

The activities of the ACBI began with 34th Annual Conference of the Association of Clinical Biochemists of India held at Delhi organized between December 15 to 20, 2007 at Indian Habitat Centre by Dr Arun Raizada of Escorts Heart Institute & Research Centre and his team comprising several senior members of ACBI. The theme of the conference, 'Clinical Biochemistry: Today and Tomorrow' was a challenging one providing an opportunity of bringing out what was available and relevant today and what the future would hold for us. About 1000 delegates attended the conference.

A professional course in Clinical Biochemistry was conducted on this occasion on December 15 & 16, 2007 by the course coordinator, Dr. Jayashree Bhattacharya. It was intended to be a refresher course to all those who are working in the field of Laboratory Medicine. On December 17, 2007 Continuing Medical Education Programme was held covering upcoming areas of Stem Cell Therapy and Nanotechnology. There were also two Workshops on Proteomics / Microarrays sponsored by Randox and the other on New Cardiac Markers by ECL Technology, sponsored by Roche Diagnostics.

There was a remarkable mix of about 110 speakers from all over the world (USA, Canada, France, Germany, Australia, Malaysia, Japan & Thailand) who took part in the 20 Symposia that included areas of Cutting Edge Technologies like Signal Transduction, Personalized Medicine and Molecular Diagnostics (sponsored by AACC), Genomics and disease and Reproduction and Fertility. Some of the eminent global speakers were Dr. J.T. Belisle (USA), Dr. J.K. Cowell (USA), Dr. W.A. Philip (Australia), Dr. Pauline Y. Lau (USA), Dr. Marciano D. Reis (Canada), Dr. Madhu B. Anand Srivastava (Canada), Dr. Ashok Kr. Srivastava (Canada), Dr. Salil Kumar Das (USA), Dr. Jawahar Kalra (Canada), Dr. Udayan Ray (Australia), Dr. Bhushan M. Kapur (Canada) and Dr. Amitava Das Gupta (USA). In addition, we had three plenary lectures on Yoga and Health by Dr. W. Selvamurthy, Chronomics & Chronobiology: Its applications in health and disease by Dr. R.K. Singh and Transcriptional and translational regulation of expression of human cathepsin L, a lysosomal protease involved in tumor invasion and metastasis by Dr. S.S. Chauhan.

In the year 2008, the Awadhesh Saran Memorial Oration Award was presented to Dr. Satish K. Srivastava (Galveston, USA), K.L. Gupta Memorial Oration Award went to Dr. Manoj Sharma (New Delhi, India), Seth G.S. Medical College & KEM Hospital Oration

Award went to Dr. P.K. Seth (Lucknow, India) Mrs. & Dr. G.P. Talwar Oration Award went to Dr. Chandra K. Mittal (Houston, USA) and Dr. T.N. Pattabiraman Oration Award went to Dr. Udayan Ray (Tasmania, Australia). Dr. Barnali Das (Mumbai, India) received the Pitabus-Jamuna Burma Memorial Award Paper Prize, the Dr. C. Sita Devi Award Paper Prize went to Dr. Prakruti Dash (Cuttack, India) and the P.S. Murthy Award Paper Prize in the field of Infectious Diseases went to Dr. Geetanjali Gupta (New Delhi, India).

Another highlight of Delhi meeting was that the AACC gave 4 Gallwas Membership Grants to Dr. Subir Kumar Das, Dr. J.K. Gambhir, Dr. Harsh Vardhan Singh and Dr. Barnali Das. One Rolling Trophy was given to the winners of the Postgraduate Quiz. A unique feature of ACBICON 2007 was the Young Scientist's Awards. It was given to 20 Young Investigators who were selected by a panel of judges from about 400 poster presenters to present their work in 2 special sessions. The abstracts of the papers and proceedings of the conference were published in a special supplement issue of IJCB.

There were 58 Stalls in the Industrial Exhibition. The First prize for the Best Stall went to Nicholas Piramal and the Second prize for the Best Stall went to Olympus.

The social programmes were also well appreciated by the delegates. There was a Cultural Programmes based on "The Village" theme at India Habitat Centre and based on "Bollywood" theme was at Tivoli Garden.

Late Shri. A.J.Thakur Award for Distinguished services' was instituted by the family members of Mr. A. J. Thakur, to honor a person who has made immense contributions to the growth of clinical Biochemistry and Laboratory medicine in India. This award for the year 2008 was presented to Dr.A. S Kanagsabhapathy, the past president of ACBI & the pioneer to initiate Quality control programme in India.

Every year ACBI awards fellowships to distinguished members of the Association on the basis of their merit and achievements. In the last year, the fellowships were awarded to Prof. A.N. Suryakar of Dr. V.M. Medical College, Solapur (Maharashtra) and Prof. B.N. Tiwari of Nalanda Medical College, Patna.

REGIONAL MEETINGS

There were quite a number of scientific meetings/workshops organized by the State/Regional Chapters. The major ones were:

◆ National workshop on prevention of Lead poisoning





organized by the Department of Biochemistry, CSM Medical University, Lucknow on 29th March, 2008. Attended by more than 200 delegates, this workshop was inaugurated by Prof KP Sinha, Adviser, ACBI.. Prof T Vekatesh, Dr M K J Siddiqui, Director, National Referral Centre for Lead poisoning in India, Dr S J S Flora from DRDE, Gwalior, Dr Dinesh Kumar from NIN, New Delhi, Dr Krishna Jyoti Goswami, Vivekananda Inst of Med Sciences, Kolkata and Dr Subir kumar Das from Amrita Inst of Medical Sciences, Kochi were the experts who participated in this workshop. The National Referral Centre for Lead poisoning was launched on this occasion.

- ◆ UP State Chapter of ACBI was launched this year on 29th March, 2008 with Dr RK Singh as the President.
- Bihar Branch of ACBI: A CME on 'Diagnostic workup for Hepatitis B infection with special emphasis on newer markers' was organized by Bihar State Branch of ACBI on 18th May, 2008.
- ◆ Workshop & CME by West Bengal Chapter: Workshop on pre-analytical procedure was organized on May 30, 2008 by Dr Shyamali Pal on behalf of West Bengal State Chapter of ACBI. This was followed on next day by a CME on 'Quality management in Laboratory system' inaugurated by Prof CR Maity, Ex DME, Govt of west Bengal. Prof Praveen Sharma, Dr Adarshpal Singh, Prof. Subimal Choudhary were the experts who participated. The events were sponsored by BD, Ashok Laboratory, Acurex Biomedicals Pvt ltd., HD Consortium Pvt. Ltd.
- ◆ The Dept. of Biochemistry & JB Tropical Disease Research Centre, MGIMS, Sevagram had organized in February, 2008, the fourteenth short time hands on training course on Immunodiagnostics for

Inaugural Function: 35th ACBICON

The XXXVth Annual National Conference of Association of Clinical Biochemists of India (ACBICON 2008) was held from December 19-21, 2008, in ACBI (Vedic) Village, Kolkata, India. The Venue of the conference was the 'International Natural Resort', a 5 star eco-friendly state-of-art convention centre at the background of beautiful nature. This conference commemorated the Platinum Jubilee Celebration of the hosting institute, Ramakrishna Mission Seva Pratishthan, Vivekananda Institute of Medical Sciences, Kolkata.

Professional course and CME were organized on 17th December. 86 members took part in the Professional Course. The topics covered in the course were (1) Fallacies of thyroid function test by Dr. Rajat Mukherjee, (2) Case presentation under the heading "Truth & Dilemma" by Dr. Tapabrata Chatterjee, (3) Clinical Case based learning by Dr. Udayan Ray, (4) Lactate as POCT by Dr. A. S. Kanagasabapathy, (5) Role of Adeponectin and Leptin in Obesity & Insulin resistance and (6) Different methods of single parameter-when & what by Dr. Dibyajyoti Banergee.

83 trainees participated in pre-conference CME on 18th December. In this programme, Dr. Amar Das Gupta dealt on Cellular & Molecular basis for acquired abnormalities of haemoglobin, Prof. Kanjaksha Ghosh explained newer perspectives in screening and diagnosis of haemoglobinopathies, Professor Abhijit Chowdhuruy talked on Apoptosis and Dr. K.K. Srivastava on Predicting diseases.

December 18, was devoted in conducting 7 workshops and 7 Demonstrations: on (1) Clinical Proteomics, (2) Molecular Biology in Infectious Diseases, (3) Platelet Aggregation Study, (4) Sperm Function, (6) Quality Management System and (7) Immunoblot Techniques at different Institutes and Laboratories

in Kolkata which were attended by 86 delegates.

"Power of knowledge and way to improve patient care 2008" was the theme of three days of the conference. A total number of 842 registered delegates representing 21 countries including USA, UK, Canada, Germany, Finland, Sri Lanka, Nepal, Bhutan, Bangladesh, Burma, Malaysia, Japan, Australia shared their experience through 23 symposia, 126 lecturers, and 224 poster presentations. 5 Oration lectures were delivered during this period: Dr. K.K. Srivastava, Consultant in Pharma & Biotechnology, India delivered Awadhesh Saran memorial oration on "To enhance the performance and efficiency: my personal journey from some where to every where". Dr. Amitava Chatterjee of Chitranjan National Cancer Institute, Kolkata delivered K.L. Gupta Memorial Oration on "Tumor Microenvironment: A new concept and potential area in cancer research and treatment in 21st. century". Seth G.S. Medical College & KEM Hospital oration was given by Dr. Amitava Dasgupta of University of Texas Health Science Centre, Houston, USA. He spoke on "Interaction of herbal & ayurvedic medicines with western medicine". Dr. Larry Braussard of LSU Health Science Centre New Orleans, USA delivered Dr.T. N. Pattabhiraman oration on the topic "current trends in drugs of abuse testing". Mrs. & Dr. G. P. Talwar Oration was delivered by Dr. Bishnu Pada Chatterjee of the Department of Biotechnology, West Bengal University of Technology Kolkata.

The opening ceremony was held in the afternoon of 19th December, with a large crowd in attendance. Dr. Surjya Kant Mishra, the Hon'ble Minister of Health & Family Welfare, Government of West Bengal inaugurated the conference. Dr. Girdhar J. Gyani, Secretary General, Quality Council of India (QCI), was the guest of honour who explained the importance of quality in all walks of life including that in laboratory.

The evening of 19th December was marked by the 'President's Reception Dinner' accompanied by lively music and dance. December 20th evening was celebrated as cultural evening. The famous singer Mrs. Usha Uthup regaled delegates with her melodious voice and songs. Martial art dance of Manipur was another notable events on this occasion..

American Association of Clinical Chemistry (AACC) & World Association of Societies of Pathology and Laboratory Medicine (WASPaLM) participated in the conference in a big way. President of AACC, Prof. Larry Broussard released 'Guideline for Therapeutic Drug Monitoring Services' in presence of President Elect of AACC, Prof. Catherine Hammett Stabler, President Elect of WASPaLM, Prof. Michael Oellerich & President, International Association of Therapeutic Drug Monitoring & Clinical Toxicology of IATDM&CT), Prof. David Holt.

The Industrial exhibition reached a scale unmatched by any previous academic conference. The participants included 25

PROCEEDINGS OF PRE-G.B. EXECUTIVE BODY MEETING

Pre-General Body meeting of Executive Committee of ACBI was held on 18 December, 2008 at 6.00 P.M. in hall A-4 at the ACBICON 2008 venue Vedic Village, Kolkata. Dr. Arun Raizada, President ACBI was in chair.

First of all a two minute silence was observed in memory of Prof. Taranath Shetty. It was followed by condolence address by Dr. Praveen Sharma and it was decided to send a letter of condolence to the bereaved family.

In absence of the Secretary, Dr. M.V.R. Reddy, Dr. Rajiv Ranjan Sinha, Treasurer ACBI, moved for confirming the minutes of the previous Executive Committee held at New Delhi on 20 December 2007. The minutes were confirmed unanimously.

Dr. Rajiv Ranjan Sinha then presented the annual report of ACBI for the year 2008 on behalf of the Secretary, Dr. M.V. R. Reddy which was also accepted.

Dr. Rajiv Ranjan Sinha, Treasurer ACBI presented the audited accounts of Income & Expenditure for the year 2008 and a few available copies were given to members. Members wanted more copies of the audited accounts and Treasurer was requested to comply by the Post-GB meeting. The account was accepted unanimously.

Dr. Arun Raizada, the Organizing Secretary of ACBICON 2007 presented the Interim Account of the Conference which was accepted with a note that the final audited report should be

submitted within next three months.

Dr. Praveen Sharma, Editor-in-Chief of IJCB presented the IJCB report for year 2008 which was well appreciated for the improvements brought about in the quality of the Journal. Dr. Priti Nanda, Publication Manager of Springer made a slide presentation pointing to academic and marketing perspective of IJCB. She emphasized that IJCB is now well received throughout the world.

It was also resolved that this report by Dr.Nanda should be published in ACBI News Bulletin.

Prof. R Selvakumar, Convener ACBI/CMC EQAS Program presented the report in which he highlighted the introduction of lyophilized serum as EQAS sample. The number of parameters to be estimated has now gone to twenty two.

Mr. Probir Das, convener, ACBI Corporate Wing expressed to present his report in Post General Body Meeting.

Dr. K. R. Prasad, Joint Secretary, ACBI (HQ) presented the list of new ACBI members which was ratified by the Executive Body.

Dr. K. P. Sinha, Advisor ACBI raised the issue of non compliance of the rules of submitting complete account of IJCB for the period when Dr. D. N. Rao was Editor-in-Chief. Many times in past Dr. Rao was asked to submit Account in proper format





with photocopies of receipts and Cheque Book but he did not even care to reply. Dr. Usha Sharma, Convener of 9th APCCB has not submitted complete audited report of 9th APCCB duly approved by the organizing Committee. She submitted a One Page Account Statement showing only income and expenditure whereas full audited report is required to be submitted to APFCB on whose behalf that conference was organized. This has led to blacklisting of ACBI by APFCB which has influenced negatively other International organizations like IFCC.

Dr. Col. Praduman Singh had also submitted a brief audited account for ACBICON 2006 at Pune without supporting statement of accounts. Therefore he was requested to submit detailed auditor's account with all relevant papers. Col. Singh was also required to given written apology for acting against the decision of the Executive Committee while writing to MCI during his Presidentship.

Finally after discussions it was resolved to write to each of these three individuals to comply with the requirements within two months and if the reply does not come it will be presumed that they have nothing to submit after which Executive Body will be free to decide about proper disciplinary action against them.

On behalf of Secretary, ACBI, Dr. Rajiv Ranjan Sinha, Treasurer, ACBI presented the recommendation of Fellowship and Oration Selection Committee as follows and requested for its approval.

The agenda for 35th G.B. Meeting was presented by Dr. Rajiv on behalf of Secretary and was approved.

Dr. Rajiv moved the resolution for consideration of a membership issue. He proposed that a new category of ACBI membership should be introduced for those who apply for ordinary membership only for purpose of participating in the conference and should be called **Sessional Members** and if they renew their membership next year then they will be considered as Ordinary Members. A separate register will be maintained for Sessional Members. It was approved by the Executive Body.

Dr. Raghunath informed that a sizeable amount of money was kept by Dr. Taranath Shetty in account of ACBICON 2004 at Bangalore for promotion of clinical biochemistry. It was suggested that a corpus should be made from this fund and an oration in the field of Neurochemistry should be constituted in name of Dr. Taranath Shetty. Dr. Venkatesh and Dr. Raghunath were requested to look into the matter and do the needful.

It was further decided to appoint Dr.T.Venkatesh to be cosignatory of the account in place of Dr. Shetty. The Secretary shall issue this resolution for operating ACBICON 2004 account.

PROCEEDINGS OF POST-G.B. EXECUTIVE BODY MEETING

Post G.B. Executive Body meeting was held on 20.12.2008 at 5.00 P.M. in OM Hall No.3, Vedic Village, Kolkata. Dr. Krishnajyoti Goswami, President, ACBI presided. Dr. Goswami welcomed members of the new committee. In the absence of the Secretary, Dr. M.V. R. Reddy, Dr. Rajiv Ranjan Sinha represented him for the meeting and presented the proceedings of previous EC meeting held on 18.12.2008, which was accepted.

Dr. D. M. Vasudevan, AIMS, Kochi will be officially notified about his selection as next organizing secretary of ACBICON 2009.

Dr. K. K. Srivastava proposed that all oration awards should be notified at least 6 months prior to the conference so that nomination of speakers and their selections are completed 3 months in advance of the coming conference. The notice for submission of nominations should be circulated through next Jan-Feb issue of News Bulletin. This was accepted.

Dr. K.P. Sinha proposed that there should be internal auditors to examine accounts of ACBI- Head Office, IJCB, Secretariat, ACBI-Corporate Wing and preceding Conference. A set of 5 Internal auditors should be nominated from among ACBI members—one or set of 2 members should be sent to different offices to examine the accounts and report back to the Secretary & President about whether account has been properly maintained and money has been judiciously spent. This proposal was accepted and President shall nominate internal auditors.

Dr. Eric Christopher Lobo pointed that some papers are being presented by non-members of ACBI for various awards.





It was decided that for participation in meetings and conferences, non members should be charged sessional fee and for those awards where life membership or membership of 3 years are required, the applicant has to comply with that rule. This year, if the winner is required to be member, then he or she be made life member of ACBI, if he/she fulfils the requirements for becoming member, before the award is handed over.

Mr. Upendra Singh of M/s Kopran, the newly elected representative of ACBI-Corporate Wing proposed that more representatives of Corporate members should be in Executive Body of ACBI. After extensive discussion, it was decided that there shall be 3 representatives of Corporate members in the Executive Committee. A change in rules for constitution of Executive Council has to be ratified in next meeting of GB. These members shall be elected by corporate members and their names shall be communicated to the General Secretary. Internal audit committee of ACBICON will have one member from Corporate Wing. It was also decided that scientific members of corporate group can submit papers for presentation during conference. Corporate members should also write their ideas and views in News Bulletin under its Corporate Corner.

Formation of Confederation of Laboratory Science Bodies was discussed and members wondered what happened to the initiative taken by Late Taranath Shetty. No concrete decision was taken about how to go about it. The President and Secretary were advised to initiate action for bringing the Confederation in existence.

It was suggested to provide link of advertisements from Corporate Members in IJCB and News Bulletin to ACBI Website. However, since both News Bulletin and IJCB appear on ACBI Website, those advertisements are visible and no separate link will be necessary.

Conference Organizing Committee should have proper representation from Corporate Wing and they should be provided with a dedicated Corporate Wing Area at the ConferenceVenue.

It was decided to include one representative of Corporate members in the Organizing Committee.

Regarding Professional Course it was resolved that the proposed Professional Courses should not be linked to any university and should be administered by ACBI. A draft for preparation of the brochure giving detail of the course and Examination will be prepared by a committee headed by Dr. U. M. Donde with two other members : Dr. Eric Christopher Lobo & Dr. Harshvardhan Singh and which shall be presented to the Secretary within 2 months. This draft will be further considered by a committee of members consisting of President, Dr. K. Goswami, Past President Dr. Arun Raizada, Dr. K. P. Sinha, Dr. Praveen Sharma, Dr. U. M. Donde and Dr. Jayashree Bhattacharya to give final shape to the Brochure. It was also decided that Dr. K. K. Srivastava will continue to organize lectures under Professional Course through electronic media as he is doing with other coordinators. This endeavor of Dr. Srivastava was well appreciated.

The meeting ended with vote of thanks from the President.

ACBI / CMC EQAS ANNUAL REPORT FOR THE YEAR 2007

Presented at the ACBI Confrence, 2008 at Kolkata

I am happy to report that our ACBI/CMC EQAS has successfully completed 30 years by this year 2008. It started with 50 laboratories in 1978 and now more than 2100 labs participate in this programme. A total of 340 laboratories joined in the year 2007 as new participants. There is a marginal increase of 2 % in the Elite group compared to 2006. It is encouraging to observe a 3% decrease in the group 5, inspite of the many new labs who joined half way through the cycle. There is not much difference in the OMVIS between the years 2006 and 2007 among various groups.

We are very happy to launch the long awaited lyophilized QC from 2009 onwards. Already 6 samples have been sent to all the labs for the trial run, and the result analysis is on its way and the report will be available on the net by January 2nd 2009. The registration fee for the next cycle is increased to Rs. 2000/to meet the hike in courier charges and for the increased expenses towards lyophilization. The annual report for the year 2008 along with the participation certificate will be sent to the labs during the month of Feb 2009.

The number of parameters is increased to 22 in the lyophilized QC and the electrolytes can be analysed on the ISE systems also. There is going to be a slight change in the EQAS

web software, which is more user friendly. Since we are going towards paper less operations, we will not accept any results that are sent by post or by e mails. We want all the labs to enter the results into the EQAS website. This way we may minimize the transcriptional errors. We also want the labs to look for the monthly reports only in the website. It is impossible for us to printout individual lab results because of the huge numbers.

I thank the Executive Committee and the members of ACBI for their continuous support to run this programme. At this time I request the members to encourage their laboratories to use the web facility for entering as well as viewing the reports.

At this juncture, I would like to thank Dr. Geethanjali my colleague who has been taking care of the day to day running of the Quality Control programme, Mr. Manikandan who has been employed by us to help in the Quality Control programme and all my other department colleagues for the keen interest and enthusiasm they have been showing in running the Quality Control programme successfully.

ACBI PROFESSIONAL COURSE

The Association of Clinical Biochemists of India is on way to having regular course in clinical biochemistry. In this direction our Course -coordinator Dr. K. K. Srivastava has designed structured course to be imparted through distant education. It is envisaged to have some tutorial-cum-practical training by bringing trainees in close contact with teachers at selected places. These courses are aimed at giving degree/diploma to successful trainees by holding proper examination. Presently, the Executive Committee has decided that ACBI will impart this degree as an independent authority without aligning with any university. Dr. U. M. Donde has been nominated to prepare blue print for administration of the course and holding examination. However, this degree will be of no avail if it is not recognized by competent authority. Efforts will be made for accreditation of the course by competent authority before actually holding the examination.

In addition to the distant mode of education, we are also thinking of having class room education in well recognized institutions under good teachers of clinical biochemistry. Such courses will be designed to guide the trainees towards acquiring knowledge to become competent clinical biochemists. The students would learn more from text books and working in a good clinical laboratory. We have to identify such centers where the course can be run for limited periods. Therefore, we will be seeking support from our members working in good medical colleges and hospitals. I would appreciate if some good teachers in bio-chemistry in medical colleges and hospitals come forward to volunteer for running the course. Many institutions will be happy if such courses are conducted in their places.

I request you to give your name to the Secretary, Dr. M.V. R. Reddy (reddymvr@gmail.com), if you can conduct course in your institution (College/hospital) and / or you want to give time for teaching.

I also request members to write their views regarding how the course should be conducted to be really useful to fulfill its aim.

1. Awadhesh Saran Memorial Oration Award

INTERESTING LABORATORY REPORTS

Discrepancies in Urea & Creatinine Values of a Patient Undergoing Hemodialysis

A male patient, aged 64years, having history of chronic renal failure and on hemodialysis for the last 5 years underwent investigations and the predialysis reports were:

S.Urea 155 mg/dl S.Creatinine 8.5 mg/dl S.Potassium 6.9 mmol/l

Routinely same patient was investigated for same parameters after hemodialysis the reports were surprising:

S. Urea 12 mg/dl S. Creatinine 0.7 mg/dl S. Potassium 3.0 mmol/l

The post hemodialysis sample was sent for inter laboratory correlation and reports were found to be similar.

After 24 hours the blood sample of the patient was drawn and again tested for same parameters and the reports were:

S. Urea 85mg/dl S. Creatinine 3.9mg/dl

DISCUSSION

The post dialysis sample is generally being collected from venous pressure connector. The rationale is to assess

the efficacy of the hemodialysis procedure. As stated by my Nephrologist friends, if there is a 60% reduction of creatinine value compared to predialysis, efficacy is considered to be optimum. Hence to obtain a perfectly normal urea and creatinine values after hemodialysis was impossible. Then what was the reason of such reports.

After completion of hemodialysis, a small procedure known as "saline flush" is being performed. The standard procedure is to draw the post dialysis blood sample from venous pressure connector followed by saline flush. On that day due to inexperience/or may be the technician in charge of the procedure was not very careful. Post dialysis sample was collected after the process of saline flush leading to faulty sample collection. When post dialysis sample was collected from the connector the blood sample was contaminated with saline. As a result the urea and creatinine values became very low which was not acceptable in this patient. The blood sample was collected from the patient after 24 hours when he came to hospital outdoor and it was as expected. The reports were:

S. Urea 85mg/dl S. Creatinine 3.9mg/dl

Comments on the Clinical Cases 4 & 5 Published in News Bulletin Vol. 37, No. 02 (Sept., 2008)

CASE 4, 2008

49 year female with a past history of hypercalcaemia and nephrocalcinosis had parathyroid surgery in 2005. In 2007, the patient was seen to have anxiety, tiredness, and tachycardia and feeling generally unwell.

She subsequently presented to the endocrine clinic for management of her thyroid condition. The results of thyroid function tests done during these visits are shown in the table below.

COMMENT ON CASE 4

TABLE 1

The FT4 and FT3 results are in the hyperthyroid range and are diagnostic for hyperthyroidism. However the TSH results continue to remain in the normal range throughout. The raised T4 and T3 levels have not caused suppression of pituitary TSH release due to negative feedback.

This would seem to indicate that the pituitary has become autonomous with TSH release. This is characteristic of a pituitary tumour producing TSH (TSHoma).

Autoimmune thyroid markers like a-TPO and Thyroid Receptor Antibodies (TRAB) were done to rule out autoimmune thyroid disease.

Comments re: TSHoma: TSHoma is a rare cause of hyperthyroidism with an incidence of <1%. It should be considered as a possible cause especially in the presence of diffused goitre and absence of Graves' disease.

Approximately 25% of TSHoma secrete one or more other pituitary hormones. The molecular causes for TSHoma are thought to be somatic mutations or abnormal oncogene expression.

CT/MRI evaluation is necessary so that surgical and/or medical management can be considered. Surgery offers only a 30% cure rate hence additional medical management is required.

TABLE 2

IGF-1 is a growth factor and can be elevated in Tumorigenesis of various tumours. It can act agonistically as a growth promoting factor and is useful in supporting diagnosis.

A-subunit glycoprotein is another useful marker, especially, of pituitary tumours. It is a useful marker in establishing a tumour process.

SHBG, a binding protein of testosterone and oestradiol, is synthesised in the liver and often used as a surrogate marker of metabolic rate in the above situation. In hyperthyroidism there are high SHBG levels.

20 year old female investigated for irregular periods, obesity and increased tiredness.

COMMENT ON CASE 5

The clinical finding of irregular periods, obesity in association with high androgen needs consideration of polycystic ovary syndrome (PCOS).

In the case presented, a raised free androgen index (FAI) along with low Estradiol supports the diagnosis of PCOS. 50-90% of PCOS women will have an elevated serum androgen concentration. Although not universally present, a higher LH to FSH level with an LH/FSH ratio of 2 and > 2 is an often diagnostic finding.

In addition, the clinical finding of obesity with high C-peptide to maintain euglycemia is indicative of some degree of insulin resistance. Approximately 45% of PCOS women will have impaired glucose tolerance (IGT). A glucose tolerance test will establish the degree of IGT in this case.

Thyroid function is normal and so is Prolactin. A normal Prolactin rules out this hormone as a cause of menstrual irregularities. Exclusion of other causes of hyperandrogenism and menstrual irregularities, such as congenital adrenal hyperplasia, androgen secreting tumours have to be done.

Finally, a pelvic ultrasound to confirm presence of polycystic ovaries forms an essential part of management.
